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FOREWORD

I am happy to present the Annual Report of our University for the year 2019-20. Over 39 years, Mangalore University has grown in stature and is recognized as one of the premier Universities in the country.

Our University has been known for its commitment to teaching, research, conducting academic programmes and examinations as per schedule. We have the Choice Based Credit System at both the undergraduate and postgraduate levels. The admission of Research Scholars and foreign students for Ph.D. and P.G. programmes on the campus has increased considerably due to several academic and administrative initiatives taken in recent years.

Our teaching faculty have rendered themselves creditably in their teaching and research activities. H-index of the University which was 32 in the year 2013, has reached 64 which clearly shows that research has progressed in the University. The research programmes are strengthened through the Research and Consultancy Promotion Cell. All the teachers and SC/ST research scholars are provided with laptops. The University has introduced several welfare programmes for SC/ST students under SCP-TSP grants sanctioned by the Government. For the first time the University has appointed leading academicians from India and abroad as Adjunct Professors to teach our students.

The basic facilities available on the campus include administrative building, faculty buildings, library, student's hostels, staff quarters, guest houses, Mangala Auditorium, well-equipped outpatient health centre, sports facilities like gymnasium, indoor stadium and play grounds with 400 mtr. track. The University has its own water supply arrangement on the campus. Other facilities like banking with four ATMs, cyber café, Inlibnet and postal services are available on the campus. CCTV surveillance systems are installed on the campus and in our constituent colleges. The street lights on the campus are being solarised.

Mangalore University has Wi Fi connectivity on the campus. The university has developed a new web portal with information kiosks and displays. The Library has access to 25+ data bases from the UGC Infonet. Anti-plagiarism software through Shodh Ganga Project has been introduced.

The University has advanced science research facilities, viz., Microtron Centre, Centre for Application of Radioisotopes and Radiation Technology (CARRT), Promotion of University Research and Scientific Excellence (PURSE), Centre for Advanced Research in Environment Radio Activity (CARER), OASTC, etc.

The University maintains a close liaison with the public of the coastal region and Kodagu through various outreach programmes including University-Industry interaction, extension activities through Prasaranga, NSS and various Endowment Chairs and Study Centres.

The University provides scholarships for meritorious students. There are other endowment scholarships also for the meritorious but poor students. Mangalore University has contributed in developing sports in the state through the affiliated colleges. At the Inter-University level, we have produced more than 100 international sportspersons and athletes who have brought laurels to the country by winning medals at different levels. The University has introduced sports scholarships for talented sports persons. Incentives for Inter-University new record creators and incentives for All-India Inter-University medal winners are given every year.

We have taken all efforts to develop the P.G. Centre at Chikka Aluvara, Kushalnagara. We have established a First Grade College at Mangalagangothri to cater to the higher educational needs of the local people and also started an Evening College at University College, Mangaluru to help students to continue their studies while pursuing a profession. Our constituent colleges such as University College, Mangaluru and Field Marshal K.M. Cariappa College, Madikeri are recognized by the U.G.C. as College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) for five years. University College, Mangaluru has been considered under the scheme of Special Heritage Status and received a special grant of Rs.183.00 lakhs from the UGC for restoration of Ravindra Kala Bhavana.

The University provides a safe and peaceful environment that is conducive to learning with the active support of students, faculty, administrative staff, and the various authorities.

2. University Authorities:

a. Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Challenges (SWOC) analyses made and action taken:

Strengths:

- The University is accredited by NAAC. Now the University is preparing for the 3rd Cycle of NAAC.
- Excellent research facilities developed through funding from, DST-PURSE, DST-FIST, UGC-SAP, DAE-BRNS, BRIT, DOD, etc.,
- Exposure of faculty to international laboratories/research centres through various International fellowships and MOUs
- Well developed, spacious library with ICT, e-resources facilities. Computer Centre with mail, web and application servers.
- Sports facilities like gymnasium, indoor stadium, play grounds, outdoor stadium with 400 metres track are available. Facilities are also available for other extra-curricular activities.
- Directorate of correspondence to provide higher educational facilities for the needy people.
- Training of SC/ST/OBC students for competitive examinations, such as UGC-CSIR/UGC-NET/CIVIL SERVICES/ICAS, etc.
- Prasaranga, study centres and peetas are engaged in spreading knowledge to the society and researching on the issues/ problems related to women, weaker sections of the society, etc.
- Extension of consultancy services.

- Promptness in administrative procedures.

Weaknesses:

- Limited academic and physical infrastructure and human resources.
- University is situated in a rural area.
- Limited funds for cutting edge research.
- Less of inter-disciplinary/multi-disciplinary approaches.
- Inadequacy of infrastructural facilities to introduce ambitious academic programs.

Opportunities:

- The University has already initiated industry interactions for the academic programs and placements which will be helpful in developing the partnership with industries.
- Syllabi of many courses are framed in consultation with industries which provide job opportunities to our students.
- University has a few National facilities for research which can be extended to other institutions and Universities in order to generate funds to the University.
- Various collaborative research programs, Faculty exchange programs with foreign Universities will be helpful in facilitating high end research activities. This makes provision for sharing of intellectual properties.
- Exploitation of research potentials to generate revenues in the form of strategic consultancy.
- Increase the access by strengthening distance education programmes and adoption of information and communication technologies more effectively.
- The location of the University in the foot hills of the Western Ghats and Coastal Region provides ample opportunity for research on Biodiversity and Conservation.
- The scope for extending the consultancy services.
- Faculty exposure to international laboratories/institutions will be useful to take up high end research and teaching.
- Enhancement of equity initiatives

Challenges:

- Increased competition, due to establishment of private and public Universities around the Campus.
- Limited financial support from State Government.
- Increased privatization of higher education.

- Inadequate amenities for marginalized section to increase the enrolment.
 - Entry of foreign universities to higher education.
- b. Short-term and long-term perspective plans, administrative measures taken, Training to the non-teaching staff:
- To increase the ability of the University to realize the potential to compete with institutions of excellence at the global level.
 - To enhance the quality of teaching-learning process.
 - To increase the access to higher education for the socio-economically backward, SC/ST/OBC community people.
 - To increase the enrolment ratio in the University.
 - To promote, acquire and access a cutting edge technical knowhow/skills for the improvement of research ability of the scholars in the University.
 - To enhance the employability of the students through value added education.
 - To expand existing and to create additional Physical, Academic and Research infrastructure to increase the enrolment.
 - To enhance the consultancy activities and generate revenues.
- c. Administrative and academic reforms ushered in – based on NAAC Peer Team recommendations and Administrative and Academic Audit (AAA) Committee reports (copies of recommendations/reports may be annexed):
- The NAAC committee report and AAA reports
- Academic autonomy is provided and the faculty members are encouraged to participate actively in academic activities such as conference organization, participation and also to execute R&D projects of national importance.
 - University has taken steps to appoint qualified faculty where there is acute shortage. Eminent scholars working in industry/abroad/institutes of national importance are invited to work as Adjunct Professors, thereby creating a conducive environment for academic growth of student community
 - The teaching and non-teaching staff were given training on IT-related concepts so that it is useful to adopt e-governance in the university administration.
 - A research policy is developed to address the issues related to utilization of equipment available in central facilities
 - Adoption of e-governance in the administration has been taken up.
 - Chairs are made active by providing financial support from the university to organize events, as well as to carry out research works.

— Efforts are made to have green audit and university has got 2nd place at all India level during 2019-20.

— The incubation center is established with the support of IBM, Bangalore and skill-development Workshops are conducted on recent technologies such as Internet of Things, Artificial Intelligence, Machine Learning, Business Intelligence etc.

d. Administrative measures for networking and development of PG centers/additional campuses, on par with main campus:

— Jnana Kaveri Post Graduate Centre of Mangalore University is situated in Chikka Aluvara, Somwarpet taluk, Kodagu district. The Director-In charge is appointed to liaison with the main campus.

— In January 2014, MSc Biochemistry and MSc Microbiology were shifted from FMKMC College, Madikeri, and Kodagu to Chikka Aluvara.

— In August 2014, MCom and MSW programmes commenced with the admission of 30 and 12 students respectively.

— In August 2015, MA Kannada, MA History, MA Political Science programmes were started with 13, 10 and 12 students respectively.

— In August 2017, MSc Botany, MSc Chemistry and MSc Computer Science programmes were started with 07, 16 and 05 students respectively.

— Altogether there are 12 approved programmes at Jnana Kaveri PG Centre.

— Video conferencing facility has been created in order to have day-to-day interaction and surveillance system is developed to monitor the activities

— Syndicate meetings are being conducted at Jnana Kaveri campus occasionally

e. Promotion of impact driven and socially relevant research (Ph.D. topics, projects proposed to funding agencies, research publications, inter-disciplinary research and extension) activities:

Under different faculties, our university has focused on the following research areas which are socially relevant to the Mangalore University region and also to promote interdisciplinary research works. The research works envisage to carry out research of international standard on some of the frontier areas mentioned below considering the geographical and social needs in the interest of the region in particular, and state and nation at large. The following aspects cover the core areas of research.

This includes –

- **Thriving Marine economy and ecosystem:** The coastal region in which the University is located hosts the state's only major port and has a thriving marine economy, and marine resources constitute major chunk of region's revenue and employment base. Considering the significance of sea to the region Mangalore University has a long-established Department of Marine Geology, adding now the programmes of Geo-informatics and Geography. Coastal regulation act, Erosion of the coast and its impact, pollution at sea and coast, quality and related issues of water flow into the sea are just some of the areas of research in the University that now could be used as a base for global knowledge linkages.
- **Indian Ocean Studies:** Being in the southern tip of India, Mangalore University is ideally located for Indian Ocean Studies. Indian Ocean has increasingly acquired commercial and security significance and in the background of increased foreign powers' presence in the region this study has become important. Increased piracy, large cargo and oil movements, pollution related issues, cooperative structures among Indian Ocean Rim countries, Sagar Kavacha initiatives of Indian government, instability and turmoil in the Island countries of Indian ocean and military bases of foreign powers have made Indian ocean an extremely important area and has drawn the global attention. Mangalore University wishes to be a centre for such global studies on Indian Ocean with due emphasis on coastal security.
- **Local culture, folklore and expressive forms:** The region has a healthy mix of all religions. People speak different languages and the prominent ones are Tulu, Konkani and Byari besides Kannada and its variants (Arekannada, Kundapura Kannada etc). Tulu, spoken and understood by the majority, is supposed to one of the oldest Dravidian languages with rich cultural heritage. The local culture, folklore and expressive forms such as Yakshagana, Kambla, Nagaradhane, Bhootaradhane, and Padhana etc make the region distinct and the University a center for the study of these distinctive cultures. Aware of the distinctive features, the University also has started a Yakshagana Research Centre, Ratnakara Varni Jain Study centre, Tulu Adhyayana Peeta, Shivaram Karanth Peeta etc to promote research in local culture in addition to research carried out by Departments such as Kannada, Sociology, History, which has attracted significant foreign interest. Many researchers from Japan, Germany and Finland etc. have done substantial research work on local cultures supported by Mangalore University. Siri Mahakavya Sangraha, that is collection and study of oral tradition, for instance, is a collaborative work between Mangalore University and Turku University, Finland and more of such work is envisaged.

- **Community-based organizations and private initiatives:** The region is known for private initiatives and many community organisations based on religion, community and profession have been rendering social services, interestingly across communities making the region distinct. These organisations have enabled political mobilization, increased literacy rate, provided health care facilities, and expanded banking reach and financial inclusion. This drive by the community organization is typical of the region and potential for global study.
- **Rural development:** The rural development pattern is distinct again in terms of private initiatives and success stories of initiatives like Sri Kshetra Dharmasthala Rural Development Project (SKDRDP) and Siri Gramodyoga that has transformed the nature of rural area. The rural areas have successful Total Sanitation Campaigns (TSC), quality schools, better health services, good banking and cooperative banks that makes the region distinct. Most of these are the results of local initiatives and community supported activities.
- **Community studies and ethnicity:** The region has distinct tribes and communities with their own cultural practices and their study is a fertile area for research. Kodavas, for instance, have community sports practices that make them distinct and many communities have typical spirit worship customs and practices that again has been drawing the attention of scholars. The community studies offer scope for greater collaborative global research.

The frontier areas of research works in science and technology include keeping in view of the geographical concerns, societal needs and other logistics. The university falls under the coastal areas of Karnataka and has got an easy access to the unique Western Ghats. Western Ghat flora are known for long time to be legendary source of herbal plants with medicinal values. Some of the advanced research works focus on isolation, characterization, and drug development of the plant products for a variety of indications among human and animal populations. These include bioprospecting and conservation. In addition, important emerging areas like Nanotechnology, Drug Design and Development, Radiation Biophysics, Solar Energy and Solid Waste Utilisation have been included within Core areas of research.

The core activities of research are in the areas of

- Western Ghats ecosystem - analysis, conservation and protection of endangered flora and fauna.
- Research and development of plant-based drugs for various indications.
- Research and Development of drugs and delivery systems and remedial technologies to alleviate chronic infectious diseases.
- Advanced materials and devices using Nanotechnology

- Improved flora of the Western Ghats of the coastal Karnataka region, soil health and soil mapping.
- Cataloging, mapping and bar coding of plant diversity.
- DNA Finger Printing of selected / endangered flora.
- Commercializing Orchid culture and preservation using nanotechnology.
- High throughput production of viral free plants through tissue culture for rapid propagation.
- Multiplication and conservation of endemic and endangered plant species.
- Collaborating with other institutions through interdisciplinary research and industry – academia interactions.

f. Promotion of excellence in higher education:

- International and National conferences were conducted by the University.
- Over the last year, five MOUs with international institutes have been signed for collaborative programmes and research.
- To motivate young researchers and students, over 35 senior academicians and researchers have been appointed as Adjunct Professors to various departments. The University has adopted 'Back to roots' initiative and brought good teachers and research scholars working abroad in reputed Universities to Mangalore University.

Initiatives taken to promote overall development of the university:

- The Research centres like CARRT, CAREER are established and the facilities in the PURSE labs are strengthened to carry out frontline research.
- The University has started new UG as well as PG programmes in accordance with changing trends in higher education. A new college on the Mangalagangothri campus is offering BA, BBA and BCom courses. The university has also opened an Evening college at the University College, Mangalore premises to cater to the educational requirements of the working class in the city.
- **Technological Initiatives:** The University campus is made a Wi-Fi campus so that internet is available 24 hours for stakeholders on the campus. The University offices are made paperless by providing a computer to all the non-teaching staff. The university has also adopted e-governance initiatives of the Govt. of Karnataka. ICT has become an integral part of teaching and learning. Accordingly, action has been taken to provide Audio-visual and ICT facility to all the classrooms. All faculty members have been provided with laptops so that they can utilize all e-resources for

effective teaching. The SC/ST research scholars and PG Students are provided laptops under SCP/TSP grants apart from giving them extra books in the library for their studies. The Library has a cyber-lab for online reference of books and journals. Remote access has also been provided for the users to see the online resources in the library from anywhere anytime. Anti-plagiarism software has been installed in the library so that all researchers can check their articles and thesis for plagiarism and improve upon the quality of publications. CCTV cameras have been installed in the entire campus.

- **Green Initiatives:** All Science labs are converted into modular labs providing for anti-rust, anti corrosion materials for arrangement of equipments in the laboratories. A vermi-compost plant for waste management has been started. A solid waste management plant has been initiated in collaboration with the Zilla Panchayat to help villages in maintenance of waste. A campus cleaning programme has been started in which all faculty and students are involved in cleaning the campus every third Saturday of the month. Installation of solar energy systems and rain water harvesting has been completed. All street lights on the campus are now converted to LED lighting so that power can be saved and utilized in a better way.

- **Other Initiatives:** An important initiative is introducing Mangalore University to the International community and bringing International Students to the University for study and research. We now have about 140 international students on our campus doing their UG, PG and PhD studies. The achievers in Sports and Cultural activities from the Alumni of the University are felicitated every year on the Foundation Day. Encouragement is being provided to sports through formulation of sports policy and providing fellowships to sportsmen for higher education. Information Kiosks and Digital Signage boards are installed on the campus and in all constituent colleges such that students can get any information from the University and see the programmes in the University. Village adoption programmes are initiated under the banner 'MANGALA YOJANE'- taking the University to the village to help villages in developing on all fronts.

- g. **Welfare measures for SC/ST/OBC/Women/Divyangi and others:**
Several welfare measures have been provided to SC/ST/OBC/Women/Divyang and others community. The following cells have been strengthened and are aimed to provide the needed facilities to the student community:

SC/ST Cell

- A special Cell for the welfare of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes in Mangalore University has come into existence for effective implementation of the programmes and policies of reservation. The Cell is advised by a Standing Committee on various policy matters pertaining to academic and non-academic matters under the Chairmanship of the Vice-Chancellor.
- The Cell awards SC/ST research fellowships and contingency grants to the Ph.D. students. It also extends financial assistance to various programmes such as study tour, preparation of dissertation/project reports, purchase of sports kits and computer training. Training programmes for the SC/ST students appearing for UGC/JRF/Lectureship examinations, facilities awareness programme, career guidance and personality development programmes are also conducted.
- A database of the SC/ST students studying in the affiliated colleges of Mangalore University and Post Graduate departments of Mangalore University is maintained in the SC/ST Cell.
- SC/ST Cell is in charge of getting scholarships, EBL charges of the hostel inmates and reimbursement of fees from the Government for SC/ST students studying in the Post Graduate departments.

The following are the activities of SC/ST Cell during the year 2019-20

A Special Cell for the Welfare of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (SC/ST Cell) has been in existence since 1996 and is as per the guidelines of the University Grants Commission. The Committee ensures the effective implementation of reservation policy and other welfare measures meant for SC/ST students.

SC/ST Cell in Mangalore University is functioning well with the cooperation of Special Officer and other supporting staff. Dr. Puttanna K Assoc. Prof., Department of Business Administration is Special Officer of SC/ST Cell.

4. Other activities:-

j. Innovative measures to ensure announcement of results before commencement of next semesters of UG and PG degree courses

Mangalore University examination section is continuously progressing by adapting the available latest technology and the best practices. Some of the innovative measures are as follows.

- Student data is directly imported from the Online Admission Data
- Exam Registration and the IA marks entry are being done online.
- Examination Admission Cards are issued directly to the colleges through online.
- For valuation, the answer scripts of all the courses are coded.
- The coding of the answer book is done completely automatic by using printers which have the capability of printing codes directly on the answer scripts, hence reduces the mistakes that would happen in manual process.
- Since all marks entries (both theory and practical's) are entered by valuer/examiners, as a result wastage is minimum, such as error in marks cards etc are very minimum.
- During Oct/Nov 2018 exams University has introduced a new system of online entry of marks in the valuation centre itself and results were announced within a week of completion of valuation work.
- During April/May 2019 Exams all practical marks were entering online by the Colleges where practical exams were conducted.

4. Organization and Administration:

a. Procedures to address intra and inter campus administration:

- Adoption of video conferencing system for day to day activities monitoring
- Regular meetings with Chairpersons, Directors, and Principals
- Onsite visit to the campus departments, PG centre and colleges on need basis
- Entrusting responsibilities to the Heads of the Departments to work as an interface to the Administration for smooth functioning of the departments
- Follow-up activities monitoring through discussion on action taken report in the apex bodies of administration such as Syndicate and Academic Council.

b. Measures to address vacancies in administrative/technical/support staff:

- The details of vacancies available under both Teaching and Non-Teaching is uploaded in the UGC website.
- Measures have been taken to fill up the teaching staff vacancies (Backlog and Hyderabad-Karnataka vacancies) and the details are sent to KEA as per the Higher Education Department orders.
- Adjunct Professor, Visiting Professor, Guest faculty and temporary non-teaching staff were appointed on need basis for the smooth functioning of the university in terms of both teaching and support.

- c. Campus Security (Main and other campuses):
- i. Surveillance System is deployed in the Mangalagangothri Campus, PG Centre Chikka Aluvara and University College, Mangaluru.
 - ii. The security services have been deployed for 24x7 management of the campuses.
- d. Welfare measures for non-teaching and teaching staff:
- i. University has taken many measures for enhancement of professional competencies of the teaching and non-teaching staff, University encourages faculty members to attend and participate in Orientation programmes, Refreshers courses, summer and winter schools, Workshops, Seminars, Conferences and Symposia. The University constantly encourages and motivates faculty members to apply for funded research projects offered by different funding agencies and also provides seed money of up to Rs. 1 lakh for junior faculty members to start their research activity and develop basic facilities to carry out research. Inter-disciplinary and cross-disciplinary research is being promoted by offering seed money of Rs. 5 lakhs to researchers from across faculties. Paid study leave is granted for one year to do Post-Doctoral research, as well as sabbatical leave for completing research work. Acknowledging the role of, and importance of teachers in the growth of institutes of higher education and to motivate teachers, the University has instituted the Best Teacher Award for university teachers, and selected faculty are presented with a citation and a cash prize of Rs. 25,000/-. The non-teaching staff are also encouraged to attend training programmes organized by the University administration as well as other institutions.
 - ii. The University campus is a self-contained facility that provides all the essential facilities and infrastructure for the pursuit of excellence in higher education. There is an impressive administrative building, two guest houses for visiting dignitaries and faculty, a well-equipped health centre, a useful shopping complex, two nationalized banks, and ATM centres. There is a post office and a telephone exchange on the campus. The University has provided residential quarters for its employees on the campus itself. On the University campus, there are two hostels for men and women, and a hostel for working women. Solar water heaters have been installed in all hostels. There are playgrounds and courts, a modern gymnasium, and indoor sports facilities. The employees of the University, formed the Vishwamangala Education Society and have been successfully running a primary school, high school and a Pre-University College on the campus. They also manage an employee's Cooperative Society catering to the needs of employees and students. Thus, the university has a Health Centre, Day Care Centre, English medium school, Cooperative credit society, well laid out lawns and gardens

near double road, 400 metre track, gymnasium and Stationary shops. University also provides Drinking Water facility supply and water purified system.

- iii. The University conducts periodic training programs on adopting new technologies of ICT to better equip the teachers in use of computer and internet.
- iv. The internet facilities are made available to researchers, academics, students and administration to access digital information and communicate. At the beginning of each academic year, the University prepares and distributes the academic calendar which clearly notifies the commencement and end of all the academic programmes, admission and examination schedules.

- Disseminating the information regarding funds available from different agencies, guide and assist faculty members in preparing project proposals to be submitted to various funding agencies.
- Co-ordinate with the principal investigators of UGC, DST, DOD, DAE and other sponsored research projects in the smooth conduct and completion of the projects.
- Organising appropriate training modules to the existing staff to record and maintain the database of the University for their routine Work.
- Creation of a directory of scientists / noted educationalists and scientific institutions for interaction of the faculty members and scholars.

- Liaisoning with funding agencies/departments/teachers/scholars to promote collaborative and interdisciplinary academic endeavours.
- Planning and organising meetings of the Planning, Monitoring and Evaluation Board from time to time in consultation with the Vice-Chancellor.
- Organising/co-ordinating exhibitions, demonstrations, conferences, seminars, special lectures etc. to promote research culture among the faculty members and research scholars.
- Assisting the Vice-Chancellor and the administration in planning, programming and implementation of various developmental activities with adequate facts and figures.

7. Compliance to the directives of the Chancellor/ Government –status report

Honorary Degrees or Other Distinctions:

- If not less than two thirds of the members of the Syndicate recommend that an Honorary degree or other academic distinction be conferred on any person on the ground that he/she is in its opinion, by reason of eminent attainment and position, fit and proper to receive such degree on the person concerned.
- The Honorary degree or distinction may be conferred only in exceptional cases. It shall not be conferred as a matter of course. Only such of the person who have contributed substantially to the advancement of Literature, Philosophy, Arts, Music, Painting or any other subject assigned to the Faculty of Arts, Science or Technology or conspicuous service rendered by them to the cause of education shall be identified for the purpose of grant of such Honorary degrees (D.Litt).

- A degree of Doctor of Laws (L.L.D.) Honoris Causa may be conferred upon such persons who are distinguished Lawyers, Judges, Jurists, and Statesmen or have made noteworthy contribution to the cause of the public.
- Honorary degrees shall be conferred only at the Annual Convocation and may be taken in person or in absentia.
- The presentation of persons at the convocation on whom Honorary Degrees are to be conferred shall be made by the Vice-Chancellor.
- The procedure outlined in the Statutes governing the Annual Convocation shall apply Mutatis/Mutandis in the case of conferment of Honorary Degrees also except that in the latter case the recipient of the Honorary degree may be allowed to make a brief address after receiving the degree and be a member of the convocation.
- The Vice-Chancellor may make suitable changes with the prior approval of the Chancellor in regard to the procedure to be followed at convocation when circumstance necessitate.

The Centre proposes to focus on developing understanding of the nature and dynamics of exclusion and discrimination at both theoretical and empirical levels. - d. Credit Accumulation and Transfer System after implementation of Choice Based Credit System (CBCS): Admission to International students and students from other states who have not studied under CBCS; lateral entry and admission of diploma students to UG degree course

CBCS Implementation at PG Level:

The University Grants Commission, New Delhi, has directed all Universities in the country to implement the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS, Semester Scheme) in both the under-graduate and post-graduate programmes and has been issuing a series of guidelines with regard to this. The Higher Education Council, Government of Karnataka, considered the implementation of CBCS and organized workshops in this regard. The Choice Based Credit System enables the degrees of Mangalore University to be on par with global standards. Given the present trend of globalization, it is all but fitting that Mangalore University has adopted the CBCS so that the acceptability of the programmes and degrees offered by the University becomes comparable and readily acceptable. The University considered the feasibility of CBCS at several levels and through the meeting of several of its statutory bodies. After due consideration, the following Regulations were drawn up.

The Salient Features of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) (Semester Scheme):

Each course in a programme shall carry certain number of credits, which normally represent the weightage of a course and are a function of teaching, learning and evaluation strategies such as number of contact hours, the course content, teaching methodology, learning expectations, etc. In the proposed programmes, the credits shall be based on the number of instructional hours per week, generally 1 credit is equivalent to one hour of instruction in theory, or 1 or 2 hours of tutorial, or 1½ or 2 hours of practical/field work/project work/internship per week.

The other features of the CBCS (Semester Scheme) are:

- The P. G. degree programmes are structured on credit based semester scheme.
- The relative importance of subjects of study and activities are quantified in terms of credits. Total credit of the programme is between 84 to 92.
- Each programme of study will have “Core” and “Elective” courses. The Core course will further consist of “Hard” and “Soft” core courses. Hard core courses will have 3-5 credits, while soft courses will have 3-4 credits.
- Two or more Open elective courses of 3 credits each shall be offered in the II and III semesters by every Department. Open elective will be chosen from other programmes within the faculty or across the faculty.
- The declaration of results is based on the grade point average (GPA) earned towards the end of each semester and the Cumulative Grade Points.
- Average (CGPA) earned towards the end of the programme with corresponding alpha –sign grade.

Provision has been made for Accumulation of credits if the students have studied in different institutions /Universities by giving them option of leaving out the courses which they have studied earlier and such credits are transferred to their Marks card.

Any student who has completed the course with a certain number of credits under the MOOC programme is also eligible to get the credits transferred to his Mark card issued by our University. Students who have studied in other state (who have not studied CBCS pattern) are allowed to take admission under CBCS by completing the papers/courses which they have studied as per CBCS pattern of our University.

Provision has been made for the Admission of Diploma holders to III Semester of degree programme as here under:

A candidate who has passed the three years Polytechnic Diploma Examination as identified by the concerned course/programme Board of Studies and approved by the University may be directly admitted to III Semester of the programme. Such candidates are eligible for grading but not for ranking.

A candidate successful at the diploma examination of Secretarial/Commercial practice conducted by the Government of Karnataka may be directly admitted to the III Semester (Second year) B.Com. Degree programme. Such candidates are eligible for grading but not for ranking.

q. **Placement Cell and Campus Recruitment**

The University Employment Information and Guidance Bureau (UEIGB) at Mangalagangothri is functioning at University campus offering services since 30 years. A State Government officer of the rank of group A gazette who is designated as Deputy Chief will be functional head and carries all functions of the Bureau. He will be an officer of the department of Employment and Training.

Career talks and conferences at affiliated colleges:

The Deputy Chief, along with his staff will visit the affiliated colleges and will address the students. Students will be briefed about various job opportunities, qualifications, age limits, scheme of examination, probable date of advertisement or exam, tips for the preparation, and coaching facilities available etc. Further, they will be briefed about higher educational facilities available in India and abroad. Career conferences will be conducted at the colleges where eminent personalities and subject experts will address the students. This will motivate and inspire students in choosing a career. Career exhibitions will also be conducted in the colleges for the benefit of students.

Facilities: The bureau has good collection of books in its library which helps student taking competitive exams for their careers. Several weekly, monthly magazines reports are purchased and made available in the reading room of the bureau. Three English newspaper and three Kannada newspapers are made available for the job seekers. Employment news (weekly) and Karnataka gazette is also obtained for the benefit of the information seekers.

Job Bulletin: A Job Bulletin comprising advertisements of various Central and State Government departments, boards, corporation, public sector undertakings, private employment opportunities published monthly.

Bureau's premises: The bureau is housed in the Mangalore University campus opposite to Institute of Management on Sheik Ali road. The bureau has a beautiful building with enough space for its activities. It has a separate reading room, registration section, and separate chambers for chief and deputy chief.

Registration facility: The bureau registers the names of all the postgraduate and professional graduates. A secondary card is also prepared to be sent to the state level special exchange for these candidates (called professional & Executive employment Exchange). The Bureau maintains data bank of job seekers by registering their bio-data for employment assistance.

Applicants are required to renew their registration once in three years either through post or in person. The persons who have completed their Post-graduation and professional graduates from Karnataka state or domicile only are allowed to register. - f. Ph.D. course work examination procedures.

After having been selected, every Ph.D student shall be required by the University/Institution/College, as the case may be, to undertake course work for a minimum period of one Semester (Six months duration). However, M.Phil Degree holders are exempted from course work. The Course on research methodology may include quantitative methods and computer applications, reviewing of published research in the relevant field as prescribed by the concerned Board of studies as per the guidelines framed by the University.

The report of course work shall be referred to the Doctoral Committee headed by the Chairman of the concerned Board of Studies and one external member for opinion. The Doctoral Committee shall consider the report and approve it as such or approve with suggestions or modifications if any or ask for a fresh course work report. The Chairperson of the Doctoral Committee shall communicate the opinion of the Committee to the Registrar within two months. Candidates working in Recognized Research Centres shall forward the report of course work directly to the Chairman of the concerned Doctoral Committee.

38th Convocation Welcome speech / Vice Chancellor report

Esteemed Pro-Chancellor of Mangalore University and Deputy Chief Minister and Minister for Higher Education, Govt. of Karnataka, Dr Ashwath Narayana, Vice Chancellor Professor P. Subrahmanya Yadapadithaya, Members of the Syndicate and Academic Council, Officers and Staff of the University, Faculty and Students, Parents and Guardians, Heads of management of various institutions, Distinguished invitees, Members of the press and media fraternity, and most importantly, my dear young graduates,

We are all aware that the Convocation is an impressive event, full of pomp and prestige, but we also know that it is the most important date in the annual calendar of a University. It is important not merely because of the associated ceremony and decorum, but primarily because of the degrees that are awarded to students. These degrees not only recognise the skills and talents of our students, and the years of diligent work that have led to the award of these degrees, but they also validate the teaching and examination processes of the University. In short, they endorse the entire gamut of activities that the University stands for, and the values that underpin and drive these activities. And for you, our young students, to receive these degrees at an impressive ceremony, accompanied by your parents or guardians and friends, is the moment of a lifetime.

I understand that this is the 38th Annual Convocation of Mangalore University, which is another way of saying that Mangalore University is a fairly young University. 40 years is not a short span of time, but in the history of an institution it is not a long period of time either. Institutions such as universities take centuries to evolve and grow, driven by their value systems and ethos.

I am happy to learn that these 40 years have been momentous for Mangalore University, during which time the University has made rapid strides in its long march towards knowledge and light. The motto of the University, "Knowledge is Light" has certainly been the driving force behind the growth of the University over these years, the guiding light behind the success story that all of us are proud of. I understand that the University came into being after due recommendation by the V. K. R. V. Rao Report as the only public university in coastal Karnataka, to fulfil the hopes and aspirations of the people of its three constituent districts of Dakshina Kannada, Udupi and Kodagu. I also understand that the University has, over the years, fulfilled these hopes and aspirations, perhaps not completely, but in substantial measure.

Therefore, let me add, that it is a proud moment for me to be here today, and I must thank the University and its Vice Chancellor for inviting me here to share with you the euphoria and joy of this grand event. It is indeed a privilege for me to witness the overwhelming sense of achievement and hope that I see writ large on the faces of our young graduates here. So let me begin by congratulating all of you who are receiving your degrees this evening, both in presence and in absentia, and by wishing all of you every happiness and prosperity in the days to come. May Almighty God Bless you with successful careers, and May you grow into confident and responsible citizens who will do this great country proud. May I must also add a word of compliment to the parents and guardians here who have nurtured their wards with such exemplary care, and to the members of the various authorities of this University and the heads of various institutions who have invested their resources and dedicated their time to the welfare of our young men and women.

The young graduates who are here this evening represent a cross-section of the youth of this country. I am sure you have been told many times over that the future of this country is in your hands. I am also sure that

many times over you have felt that you live in an impossible world. This dichotomy was perhaps well expressed by Charles Dickens, when he wrote in *A Tale of Two Cities*: “It was the best of times, it was the worst of times, it was the age of wisdom, it was the age of foolishness, it was the epoch of belief, it was the epoch of incredulity, it was the season of Light, it was the season of Darkness, it was the spring of hope, it was the winter of despair....” The fact of the matter, however, is that our view of the world depends on our perceptions. There is this story about Dharmaraya who, when asked to go out and find an evil person, came back empty-handed because he could not find any. The moral of this anecdote is that one can find a lot of good in the world if one bears a positive point of view. One of the great challenges before our youth today is to count the blessings that are available to them and to discover how fortunate they really are.

My suggestion is that you begin with the environment in which you are placed: your family, your college, your university, your state and your nation. If you look deeply and carefully, you will discover a vibrant ecosystem of positive signs. You will consider yourself fortunate that you have a family, as many others do not, a family that has loved you and cared for you. You have grown up in the nurturing care provided by your parents, which has enabled you to rise up to the level of graduation today. Again, if you look around deeply and carefully, you will see how you could not have come thus far without your teachers. It is they who have moulded your soul in the right direction, modelling skills that have empowered you to march forward with confidence. It is that love and care of your parents and gurus that we celebrate today, and which are woven into the tapestry of this Convocation ceremony. No wonder, in India we say, “Matr Devo Bhavaha, Pithr Devo Bhavaha, Acharya Devo Bhavaha!” One must be grateful to our parents and teachers who have shown us the path to self-confidence and success.

Again, if you look around deeply and carefully, then you will find that you have derived strength from the institutions in which you have enrolled as students over the years, your schools and colleges, your University itself. No doubt, Mangalore University itself has provided you with the right ethos for quality education. From what I have seen, Mangalore University reflects excellence in academics through teacher quality, student performance, curriculum development, in its evaluation, teaching and research. With its commitment for effective governance and academic excellence, Mangalore University has won a respectable place in the educational map of India. The University is the very picture of order and discipline. Guided by its vision “to evolve as a national and international centre for advanced studies and to develop and nurture quality human resource” and its mission “to provide excellent academic, physical, administrative, infrastructural and moral ambience,” Mangalore University has grown from strength to strength year after year. May I say that you have done well to choose a University of this kind. Just as we have to be grateful to our parents and to our teachers, we must be grateful to our College and our University as well.

At the same time, my dear students, you must not forget your nation. It is this nation, India, or Bharat, as we call it in our native tongues, which sustains our spirit and enriches our soul. And if you look around deeply and carefully, you will find that you have much to be proud of. We must be proud of this great land. We must be proud of our history, our culture, our ethos. For this to happen, you must remember the great signposts of our civilisational history. This is the land in which the world’s oldest university was established at Takshashila more than 2700 years ago, imparting path-breaking knowledge in 64 disciplines to more than 20,000 students at a time. This is the land that gave us the *Natyashastra*, the oldest treatise on dramaturgy in the world. We must be proud that we gave to the world critical mathematical concepts such as the zero, decimals, trigonometry, algebra and the calculus. We calculated the value of “Pi” in the sixth century. We had the first urban settlement in all of South Asia. We gave to the world three major religions. We gave to the world the principle of peace and non-violence, as well as models of governance during the Gupta age that were visionary and far-reaching. We gave to the world the great system of Yoga, first seen in the Rg Veda and which, along with Ayurveda, is India’s lasting contribution to the world.

All of us, young and old, must be proud that we belong to a great country with this kind of a stellar heritage. We must be proud of our ancient philosophy, our ancient culture, our ancient history, and our systems of music and dance that are second to none. We must be proud of our syncretic civilisation, where all have lived in peace and harmony. We must be proud of our nation.

We must be proud of other, more recent things, too. We must be proud of our freedom struggle, of the sacrifices that our people made for the freedom of the nation. Today, we are emerging as a superpower and are one of the fastest growing economies of the world. We have made major leaps forward in textiles, telecom, software, transport, pharma, chemicals, biotechnology, space exploration, remote sensing, food processing, steel and cement, mining, petroleum, and many other fields. We are the largest producers of milk, vegetables, tea, mint oil and many more. We are the world's leading developer of computer software and we sell software and services worth more than one hundred billion dollars every year. We have the largest road network in the world, the largest network of post offices in the world and the largest film industry as well. We are the world leaders in remote sensing. We were the third nation in the world to found a national space agency, and we were the fourth nation to have a satellite orbiting Mars and we were the third nation to reach the surface of the moon. We hold the world record for placing more than 100 satellites in orbit from a single launch vehicle, and we plan to send an Indian into space shortly. And we were one of the first nations to give women the right to vote.

These are no mean achievements and as young citizens of this great country, our youth must not fail to be proud of this high standing that we enjoy in the world comity of nations today. We must be proud of our Indian identity that emanates from the civilisational continuity and heritage of thousands of years. We must be proud that we live in a land where the past rubs shoulders with the present, and lights the way to a bright future. It is Ashoka's renunciation of violence that emerges triumphant in our national symbols and the chakra of peace that adorns our national flag has been with us for thousands of years.

Of course, this pride must be matched by a commitment to the nation, a commitment that will prompt all of us and particularly our youth to solve some of our most pressing problems: poverty, malnutrition, infrastructure, governance, energy, unemployment, healthcare for all, pollution, and the challenges of gender and biodiversity. For this we have plenty of resources, both natural and human. We have 25% of the world's thorium. About 50% of our population is below the age of 26, 65% of our population is below the age of 35, and it is forecast that by 2025 we will be the youngest country in the world with a median age of 29. This demographic dividend makes us unique in the world today, and we have to tap the advantages of these resources adequately and effectively to create a better world for all of us and for generations to come.

In order to make this path to the future accessible to all, we have to re-vision our system of education in a manner that brings to us the best of our traditional knowledge and at the same time gives us skills that are relevant for the times in which we live. It may be difficult to believe today that the ancient Indians paid utmost attention to making the education system relevant to their times: every one of the 64 vidyas taught at Takshashila was useful to society. Today, we need to make our education system relevant to our times by re-inventing it in line with our ancient knowledge and our current priorities and challenges.

This question of the relevance of education was well expressed by Swami Vivekananda, who said: "Education is not the amount of information that we put into your brain to run riot there, undigested, all your life. We must have life-building, man-making, character-making assimilation of ideas. If you have assimilated five ideas and made them your life and character, you have more education than any man who has got by heart a whole library. If education is identical with information, the libraries are the greatest sages of the world and the encyclopaedias are the greatest Rishis!"

For education to be relevant, students must be able to concretise their learning experiences, engage in reflective observation, be capable of abstract conceptualisation, and resort to active experimentation in an atmosphere of imagination, creativity and innovation. Our youth, holding the brilliant promise of 'demographic dividend,' must acquire domain-specific application-oriented knowledge, requisite skill-mix, positive mental attitude, constructive learning habits and progressive result-oriented values. Knowledge without character, Vidya without Vinaya, will do more damage than any good. It is needless to say that 'values' that we pass on to our children touch their destinies much more than the 'valuables' that we may bequeath to them.

I am happy to state that the New Education Policy 2019, which is in its draft stage now, makes an earnest attempt to seek relevance as a cardinal value for our education system. It provides for multiple exit and entry options for students, starting with the secondary education stage and going all the way up to undergraduate and postgraduate education and research. It is highly justifiable to introduce Liberal Education at the undergraduate

level for preparing students for future employment scenarios and professional roles. Simply tailoring people into jobs that exist today, but that are likely to change or disappear after some years, is suboptimal and even counterproductive. The need of the hour is vibrant multi-disciplinary institutions of high quality that increase capacity of higher education in India and ensure equitable access. As we do all this, we will seek to combine the wisdom of the ancients with the challenges of modern times, such that the ancient wisdom will make possible a more ethical and happier world.

As we witness the 38th Annual Convocation today, the words of Swami Vivekananda echo down to us through the corridors of time. At a time when India was reeling under the yoke of the coloniser, Swami Vivekananda went to America, not to learn anything new, but to teach the world from the wellsprings of the ancient Indian civilisation. Freedom, he said, can never be reached by the weak. “Throw away all weakness. Tell your body that it is strong, tell your mind that it is strong, and have unbounded faith and hope in yourself... Do not be dragged away out of this Indian life; do not for a moment think that it would be better for India if all the Indians dressed, ate, and behaved like another race... Go, all of you, wherever there is an outbreak of plague or famine, or wherever the people are in distress, and mitigate their suffering. Preach this ideal from door to door, and you will yourselves be benefited by it at the same time that you are doing well to your country.”

We must also remember the beautiful state anthem of Karnataka authored by Rashtra Kavi Kuvempu that we heard at the commencement of these proceedings. This immortal song highlights the greatness of the Indian ethos, of which Karnataka is an integral part. What a rousing call to awareness that was: “*Jai Bharatha Jananiya Thanujaathe, Jaya He Karnataka Maathe!*” This is the spirit that we need today, which can instil confidence and pride in the youth of this country.

Everyone of us present here, and particularly our young graduates would do well to take heart from the words of Swami Vivekananda: “The infinite future is before you, and you must always remember that each word, thought, and deed lays up a store for you and that as bad thoughts and bad works are ready to spring upon you like tigers, so also there is the inspiring hope that the good thoughts and good deeds are ready with the power of a hundred thousand angels to defend you always and forever.”

Jai Hind! Jai Karnataka!

(Framed under Sec, 40(1) (h) read with Sec 29(2) @ of the KSU Act 2000)

1. TITLE AND COMMENCEMENT

—This Statute shall be called “the Statute governing establishment of Fellowships, Scholarships, Gold Medals etc”.

—This Statute shall come into force from the date of assent of this Chancellor.

2. The Syndicate may, in consultation with the appropriate authorities of the University. Institute Fellowships, Travelling Fellowships, Scholarships, Studentships, Stipends, Medals, Prizes etc. out of the endowments, donations/funds instituted on this behalf.
3. No Scholarship, Prize or Medal shall be instituted and awarded on the basis of religion, caste of community or institution.
4. A proposal for the institution of Fellowships, Endowment Lectures, Scholarships, Studentships, Stipends, Medals and Prizes by an individual or body shall be made to the Registrar in writing accompanied by a Cheque or Bank Draft in favour of the Registrar or a Bank Challan for having credited the amount to the University Funds together with a copy of the terms of award proposed by the donors.
5. Following shall be the minimum amount to be donated by the donors for instituting an endowment in the University or the amount as revised by the University from time to time.
 - i) For awarding a fellowship or travelling fellowship Rs. 1,00,000/-
 - ii) For awarding a Scholarship/Studentship/Stipend Rs. 50,000/-
 - iii) For awarding a Gold Medal Rs. 1,00,000/-
 - iv) For awarding a Cash Prize Rs. 25,000/-
6. When a proposal for instituting a fellowship, travelling fellowship, scholarship, studentship, stipend, medal and prize is received, the Academic Council shall be consulted regarding the terms of award and the proposal along with the recommendation of the Academic Council thereon shall be placed before the Syndicate and Finance Committee for approval.
7. The Syndicate may accept such a proposal with such modification as it may deem fit necessary with regard to the conditions made in the proposal.
8. The donor shall enter into an agreement with the University regarding the conditions of award as approved by the Syndicate.
9. The University shall invest the money endowed in Government securities as it may deem fit and award fellowships, scholarships, medals, prizes etc., out of the interest accrued thereon. If in any year no medal or prize is awarded the Interest accrued thereon shall be added to the corpus of the awarded at a Convocation held before completion of one year from the date of acceptance of the endowment the donor may pay to the University separately the actual cost of such medal or prize.

10. The Syndicate shall have power to award a cash prize whenever the interest out of the endowment is not sufficient for award of Gold Medal.
11. The medals and prizes shall ordinarily be awarded at the Annual Convocation of the University.
12. The existing Fellowships, Travelling Fellowships, Stipends, Medals and Prizes shall continue as if they have been instituted under the KSU Act 2000 provided the funds donated or endowed are sufficient for carrying out the purposes for which the funds have been donated or endowed.

Yakshagana is a traditional performing art form, a popular theatre prevalent mainly in the Coastal Karnataka with its world acclaimed unique features. In fact, this theatrical art form of Karnataka is a representative art form of our State. With a history of more than eight hundred years, Yakshagana of Coastal Karnataka has developed into a highly harmonious, synthesized theater, comprising components like powerful music, colourful costumes, vigorous dance and extempore dialogues, all in their own distinguished style. In addition to its role as a form of artistic entertainment, Yakshagana has been an effective medium of information, value/moral education, especially to the masses. In its structure and performance style it enjoys both classical discipline and folk features.

— It is appropriate that Mangalore University has a centre for the study, dissemination, documentation and research of Yakshagana. Dr. P. Dayananda Pai and Sri P. Sathish Pai Trust has endowed a sum of Rupees one crore towards the establishment of Yakshagana Study Centre in Mangalore University. The activities of the centre will cover academic study, documentation, promotion, training, performances and experiments, publications, dissemination and encouragement of various activities and aspects connected with Yakshagana. It is hoped that the academic and utilitarian concern of the university for Yakshagana will serve as an institutional arrangement for the promotion of its richness and pristine beauty.

Objectives of the Centre

- Documentation, preservation, promotion and dissemination of traditional Yakshagana in all its styles (Northern, Southern) and variants (Talamaddale, Aata and Gombeyata) and to disseminate Yakshagana through the print and Electronic media at local, regional, national and international levels.
- To impart education in Yakshagana, in all its aspects like dance, music etc. to the students/interested public with the help of the Yakshagana Gurus.
- To organise performances with stress on academic purposes to propagate Yakshagana among the youth and public and to conduct workshops, lectures demonstrations, experimental performances and interactions with the artists and other schools of related arts like Kathakkali, Therukkutu etc.
- To establish Archives/Museum/Library for study and research on Yakshagana and to organise such activities that will preserve and promote the traditional beauty of Yakshagana so that its distinctive features are identified by the people and continued by them.
- To publish literatures related to Yakshagana and create a comprehensive information base about Yakshagana and to work in collaboration with other institutions, groups and agencies with similar objectives.

Report of the Yakshagana Study Centre: April 2019 – March 2020

Yaksha Mangala Museum

Dr.P.Dayananda Pai & Sri P.Sathish Pai Yakshagana Study Centre has a unique *Yaksha Mangala Museum* consisting of Models, costumes Photographs, Ornaments and Musical instruments etc. The objective of this museum and archive Centre is to depict the rich and glamorous world of Yakshagana.

The museum consists of ten human size fiber made Yakshagana models. The models of main ten characters are 'Hasyavesha', 'Pundu Vesha', 'Peetike Vesha', 'Hennu Banna', 'Bheema', 'Myravana', 'Sthree Vesha', 'Kiratha', 'Hanumantha', 'Raja Vesha'. These models were prepared following traditional Tenku Thittu style of Yakshagana by Ranga Surabhi's Mahabala Kalmadka, Sullia Taluk.

In addition to the Yakshagana Models (Southern style), human size fiber models representing the roles of Badaguthittu (Northern style) are installed in the Yakshamangala Museum. These models represent the following characters: 'Mukhya Sthree Vesha', 'Shreekrishna', 'Rajavesha', 'Kiratha', 'Kempu Mundasina Vesha', 'Hennu Banna', 'Bannada Vesha'. These models were prepared by Shri Shivakumar Ujire. Under the efficient guidance of Sri Jeevanram Sullia, the Yakshamangala Museum has been artistically established and various Yakshagana Models have been attractively installed. At the main gate of the Centre, two Yakshagana models with a height of fifteen feet have been installed. Museum is well maintained and visitors were well guided by the staff in the centre.

Nehru Study Centre

It is established primarily to bring Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru and his concerns into the fore of public memory and popular imagination and to evolve nuanced and critical perspectives on Indian Democracy. The following are the objectives of the centre.

Future plans

These lectures are organized in the university campus and other affiliated colleges. The lecture series will be in a dialogical mode enabling teachers and students to evolve critical perspectives on democracy.

- **Workshop on Democratic Political Leadership**

The centre will organize workshops in and around Mangalore University involving students and youth. These workshops will help them in developing critical perspectives on politics which in turn enable them to acquire capabilities for active citizenship and interventionist political participation and leadership.

- **Regional, National and International Seminars**

The centre will organize seminars (Regional, National and International) on Nehru and his concerns in order to recast them in the contemporary context of the nation and the world.

- **Research Projects (Short -term and long-term)**

The centre will encourage theoretical and empirically grounded research projects. These research projects would address problems and issues concerning caste, communal, religious, regional and linguistic cleavages and differences resulting in varying kinds of disparities and inequalities. These projects will also pursue their research with clearly specified conceptual framework highlighting the significant values such as democracy, secularism, diversity and pluralism.

- **Culturally anchored Studies**

The centre will initiate culturally anchored studies on traditions, every day practices and rituals of the region in order to tease out and highlight the democratic and humanitarian content in them.

- **Archive and Specialized library**

Develop a specialized library and archive on freedom movement, Constituent Assembly debates and traditions of Indian Political Philosophy.

- **Publications**

- The centre will publish a monograph on the long-term perspective and programmes of the centre at the earliest.
- The centre will edit and publish books on political theory, modern Indian political philosophy and democratic politics in India that are useful for teachers, students and researchers. This could mean a variety of publications including translations on a broad spectrum of issues.

Centre for Women’s Studies

The Centre for Women’s Studies organized various activities during the period April 2019 - March 2020. Unfortunately this academic year, the Centre could not complete several activities it had planned as a result of the Covid Crisis. The Prevention of Sexual Harassment workshop for Women’sCell coordinators for the 2 districts of Udupi and Madikeri which was scheduled to be held during March 2020, could not get fructified. Similarly plans for Women’s day celebrations, lectures and several workshops plannedalso got derailed. We hope to do all of them during the next academic year, of course with changed modes of deliverance.

In spite of the above challenges, the detailed activities of the Centre are given below:

I. Workshops:

a. Workshop on Gender Champions Training Manual

The UGC had sent several reminders during the current academic year to appoint Gender Champions in Colleges and Universities. In order to perform their duties, Gender Champions need to understand the nature of their responsibilities. The Centre had already embarked on a process of writing a manual for trainers of the Gender Champions. It was therefore felt that a workshop to discuss the progress made and to finalize the manual need to be held.

The first of the one day workshops was began on 8th August 2019. The workshop was attended by members from various NGO’s and their field workers. This also included the manual writers for the 9 units. Dr. Anita Ravishankar Director Centre for Women’s studies Mangalore University.

Welcomed those present and put through the objectives of the workshop. After much deliberations, a consensus was arrived with reference to the following: the different modules of the workshop, the content in the modules, the languages in which the module will come out in.

The work shop began with a welcome and introduction to the workshop by Dr. Anita Ravishankar Director Centre for Women's studies Mangalore University. She explained the objectives of the current workshop gave an overview of the work done so far and the direction to be taken for the completion of the manual. The importance of having Gender Champions in every College was seen in the several reminders sent by the UGC to have Gender Champions in Colleges and Universities. The current workshop therefore to finalize the Training Manual was important. She further stated that the rough Draft of the manual was ready.

The workshop was attended members from various NGO's in the city, some of whom were the manual writers. The various modules were taken up for discussions and correction.

Over a period of several discussions during a couple of months these modules are ready. These modules were to be transacted during the month of March. Since the Covid Pandemic made Colleges to close early, this is to be taken up during the current academic year, with modifications to suit the online mode.

Modules finalized for Gender Champions Manual:

The first draft of the following modules were taken up for discussion. The following were the modules decided on:

Module 1- Introduction to Gender Champions ,Who are Gender Champions,their necessity in Educational Institutions, Roles Responsibility etc, the objectives of the workshop and the role of the trainer in its successful implementation.

Module 2 - Introduction to various Gender Concepts – Sex, Gender , Difference between sex and Gender, Gender Stereotypes, Impact of Gender discrimination

Module 3- Patriarchy and its Implications. Analyzing patriarchy in various situations- family, school, workplace.

Module 4- Gender Equality and Equity, - Visualizing a Gender Equal Society

Module 5 – Constitutional Rights of Women

Module 6- Marriage Laws of Different Religions, Eligibility, Divorce, Maintenance, Domestic Violence.

Module 7- Sexual Offences, Cyber Crime, Criminal Laws, POSH,

Module 8 -Role of Gender Champions in making educational Campuses gender sensitive.

Module 9 -Action plan for Coordinators and Gender Champions viz setting of goals and monitoring and evaluating achievements.

It was decided that the manual would be bilingual – in English and in Kannada. The duration of the TOT would be for three days. It was also decided that the training could be held in each of the three districts coming under the jurisdiction of the University as this would facilitate better participation of all the teachers and Women Cell coordinators.

It was decided that since the manual involved a lot of academic and technical expertise, an honorarium of Rs. 2,000/- would be paid to the author of each module. Since the manual would be both in English and Kannada an honorarium of Rs. 1,500/- would be paid to the translators

Once girls knew how to protect themselves they could feel psychologically empowered the resource person was Mr. Karthik Kateel and his mother Smt. Shobhalatha. The local Rotract Club of Deralakatte also pooled in their resources for this one day programme. President of Rotract Club Ms. Tapasya who spoke on this occasion stated that empowering youth was part of their activities and it gave them immense pleasure to be part of these activities for the youth of rural areas.

d. Consultative Meeting and Workshop on Falling Child Sex Ratio

The district of Dakshina Kannada has been plagued by falling child sex ratio. According to 2011 census, the child sex ratio in Dakshina Kannada was 947 while in 2001 it was 952. According to the 2011 census the child sex ratio in Karnataka was 948. This meant that in Dakshina Kannada the child sex ratio was less than the state of Karnataka, although Dakshina Kannada district where Mangalore University comes had always had a high Human Development Index. Thus falling child sex ratio has always been a concern and a cause of worry for all of us here, as this has a lot of implications on the status of women. The Centre for Women's Studies had planned to undertake a series of consultative meetings in the concerned villages to find out from the stakeholders the reasons for this and also have awareness programmes to increase the child sex ratio. For this it has been envisaged to work closely with the District Administration particularly with the Women and Child Welfare Department. Several consultative meetings were held with the Department of Women and Child Welfare, Zilla Panchayat staff, health workers, police personnel, owners of scanning centres, members of NGO'S and working journalists. This was done with an attempt of working together to find out the reasons as well as increasing the child sex ration.

On February 5th an awareness programme and meeting was fixed in the village of Nelikkar in Moodabidri taluk of Dakshina Kannada District. Staff of the Department of Women and Child Welfare Zilla Panchayat, Gram Panchayat members of Nellikar, Anganwadi workers, ASHA workers, Doctors of the Primary Health Centre and villagers took part in the discussions and the workshop that followed. There was a total of 70 persons who were involved in very serious discussions.

From the discussions and the workshop that followed it became clear that there have been no cases of either female infanticide or foeticide in the village and everyone loved and wanted female babies. As most of the communities living in the village belonged to matrilineal families, female babies were wanted to continue the family line. Many families were opting for single child and they stated that whether the first born is male or female they stopped with one child. This could be reason for the skewed sex ratio.

e. Prevention of Sexual harassment in Work Places (POSH) Workshop

There were 168 participants which included Women Cell co-ordinators, members of the Local Enquiry Committees of the University and Colleges, Research Scholars, and Students. The workshop was inaugurated by Ms. Shyamala Kundar Member of the National Commission for Women New Delhi. In her inaugural address she stated how important it was to have workshops of this nature as sexual harassment is happening in spite of the laws being in place. Such workshops go a long way to make both men and women aware of the consequences of getting involved in such crimes. The Director of the Centre Dr. Anita Ravishankar in her conceptual address stated that Sexual harassment is one of the serious crimes that are happening against women. There is an ambiguity as to the nature and definition of harassment itself. Therefore it is necessary to hold such workshops with expert legal experts as it could make not only such concepts clear, but also help institutions in setting up of Local Enquiry Committees. The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of Mangalore University Prof. P.S. Yadapadithaya presided over the inaugural programme and stated his appreciation of the Centre for organizing such workshops as it was essential in today's world. He stated that most campuses of higher education was having more women and therefore issues of sexual harassment become very important.

The sessions that followed the inaugural were very knowledgeable, informative as well as cleared many of the doubts that people had. Participants were put in groups and different case studies were given to them. These sessions were handled by Ms. Merlyn Martis, Ms. Aruna and Mr. Tukaram. Preamble

- Kanakadasa occupies a distinct place in the cultural and social history of Karnataka. As a philosopher and social thinker, he has greatly influenced the contemporary history of Karnataka. Although belonging to 16th century Karnataka, Kanaka's literary expressions and cultural concerns have always found new meanings and new orientations in our time. It is in the light of the contemporary relevance of Kanaka, that the Government of Karnataka established the Kanakadasa Adhyayana Peeta and Kanakadasa Research Centre, in Mangalore University.
- For the last several years, both Kanakadasa Adhyayana Peeta and Kanakadasa Research Centre have engaged in multifarious activities in order to spread and popularized the ideas and concerns that Kanakadasa represented. These activities include publication of research papers and books on Kanaka, organization of seminars, Conferences and workshops on issues and themes concerning Kanaka and the Bhakthi movement. The Kanakadasa Adhyayana Peeta as well as the Kanakadasa Research Centre have together organized two major National Seminars, one International Conference and a good number of dissemination lectures in different affiliated colleges of Mangalore University as well as other Universities like Kannur University, Mysore University, Dharwada University, Bangalore University, Kuvempu University, Tumakur University Davanagere University, Bijapur University and outside the state Universities like Mumbai University, Madras University, Kuppam University and Osmania University. - The Kodava Samskritika Adhyayana Peetha has been established as per the Statute framed for this purpose on 27th March 2008. The purpose of the establishment has been to study and research in to the land and people of Kodagu, mainly the Kodava - speaking communities, focusing on the evolution of the history and cultural aspects of their societies. The Kodava Peetha is not only documenting the historical and cultural experiences of the Kodava communities but also assisting research and study of these communities as an Archive and a source of information.
- Current status: Functional

Some of the objectives of the Peetha are:

- To study the history of the Kodava people, and brings out the rich archaeological and literary sources that go to the making of that history.
- To explore and record the varied ethnographical and sociological facets of society in Kodagu.
- To study the religious beliefs and practices, folk traditions and performing arts of the region.
- To survey the monuments, both religious and secular, to create popular awareness for their protection.
- To study Kodava language and literature, both oral and written, to highlight the cultural identity and achievements of the people.
- To study the ecological basis of the Kodava life
- To arrange seminars, workshops, symposia and special lectures on the above themes
- To bring out monographs on the various studies on the subject, including translations
- To create an archive to preserve the documents pertaining to kodava history and culture
- To undertake such other activities as would serve the above general ends

The Peetha has been working for the implementation of these objectives and the work it has undertaken so far, has to some extent resulted in the generation of information and creation of knowledge about the land and people of the province. The tiny province of Kodagu has historically undergone varied experience from the Nayaka's rule to monarchy and through the British Colonial rule to the post-independence period. The Peetha has created a library and an archive, which constitute the social memory of the community. However, want of enough funds and manpower for the Peetha are hampering the effective implementation of its objectives.

34. LIBRARY AS A HUB OF MODERN TEACHING-LEARNING-RESEARCH ACTIVITIES:

UNIVERSITY LIBRARY:

Librarian : Dr. M. Purushothama Gowda.

Introduction:

- The University Library came into existence in the year 1980. Its collections and service facilities are fairly widespread. It has grown from mere 40,000 collections to 2, 20,426 documents. The exterior and interior environment of the library building is aesthetically attractive and user friendly. The total library building area is planned for 9000 sq. meters and planned to build in three phases. Presently, we have occupied the 6250 sq.mts. It accommodates all the sections of the library. The library accommodates 450 readers at a time. The distinguished feature of the library is open access environment with an excellent natural lighting and ventilation. We have a 63k.w. generator to overcome electricity failures. The library has two Xerox Machines. One Xerox machine to take care of the day to day photocopy needs of the library and another to take care of the library user's needs
- In the library a separate collection of NBHM, USIS, Pavanje Chair photo gallery and Prof. B.A. Vivek Rai's Publications are displayed in separate corners i.e. at the Entrance hall, Periodicals, Stack, Text and Kannada section. These publications have been useful to Faculty members and Research Scholars in Science, Social Science and Humanities. A collection of reprints and preprints on popular subjects is also being kept in the library. Display panels in both the gangways, provide information on various issues like – Admission information of various Universities, Appointments, Book Reviews, Do You Know, Faculty Publications, Fellowships, Orientation and Refresher Course details, Today's News etc.

Library Services:

- Library services reflect the postgraduate nature of the campus. All the readers are welcome to use the library services and facilities. New comers to the library are given orientation about the facilities and services of our library. The library staff is always available to help the readers. They orient new Students, Researchers and Faculty members at the commencement of their Academic / Research activity and as per their needs. Professionals in the library also help all users to use library facilities to the best possible extent. There is a wide range of printed and online indexing services available in the library. All key disciplines are covered. In the university's research environment, up-to-date information is essential. Library subscribe to over 305 periodical titles in hard copy, On-line Journals/databases 06, Online Bibliographical database 02 and 15,000 + online journals from UGC-INFONET and 45,000+ online journals from J-gate Database.
- This year we have started new services i.e. sending scanned copy of the content pages and cover pages of current journals to all the Faculty members of our University.

Library Automation:

- Till December 2017 Mangalore University Library has using Libsys version 4 Software as Integrated Library Management Software (ILMS). In January 2018 Library has switched over from Libsys to Koha Library software version – 17.11. This software developed by Katipu Communication of New Zealand, in 2000. It is implemented in large number of Academic and Public libraries all over the world. Koha software is user friendly, fully featured, scalable library Integrated management system. Koha software Development is sponsored by world's leading libraries, volunteers and support companies. It covers almost all sections i.e. administration, acquisition, cataloguing, circulation, display, OPAC, reports, tools etc. Koha Web OPAC links have been provided to Library books, e-books and e-journals which are accessible elsewhere in the world.

Computing Services:

- Information Kiosk has been installed in our library which provides information of all the activities of Mangalore University and it has been made web enabled with the help of Mangalore University Server. We have also installed web enabled TV providing information of all the programmes held on our campus in an online mode.
- We have one server and eleven terminals in all the sections of the library. We have the infrastructure to retrieve information from readymade databases available in Compact Discs, Multimedia and On-line way.
- Mangalore University Library has one Gbps (1000 Mbps) band width connecting all terminals in our university and library terminals. During this academic year, we have made provisions to Remote Access facility to access our library online resources anywhere in the world to our library users. We also introduce Wi-Fi facility to our library users on the campus.

ETD Lab:

- Mangalore University Library Established Electronic Theses and Dissertations (ETD) Lab for checking plagiarism for all submitting theses and dissertations to Mangalore University. This ETD Lab has one server, one scanner / printer, four computers and five KVA UPS. We have spent Rs.4, 35,122/- for the same. We have procured "Turnitin" Software to check Plagiarism of theses and dissertations submitted to Mangalore University at the cost of Rs. 3.50 Lakhs. 360+ Theses and 200+ Research papers has been

checked under plagiarism software. Mangalore University library has digitized and uploaded 1256 Theses and 130 M.Phil. Dissertations to Shodhganga Project of INFLIBNET at Ahmedabad. And D space Institutional Repository software.

UGC-INFONET Learning Resource Centre:

- CYBER LAB is having 56 computers. It has helped 7622 users in accessing the required information from all the e-resources available in our library from UGC- Info net and from other sources.

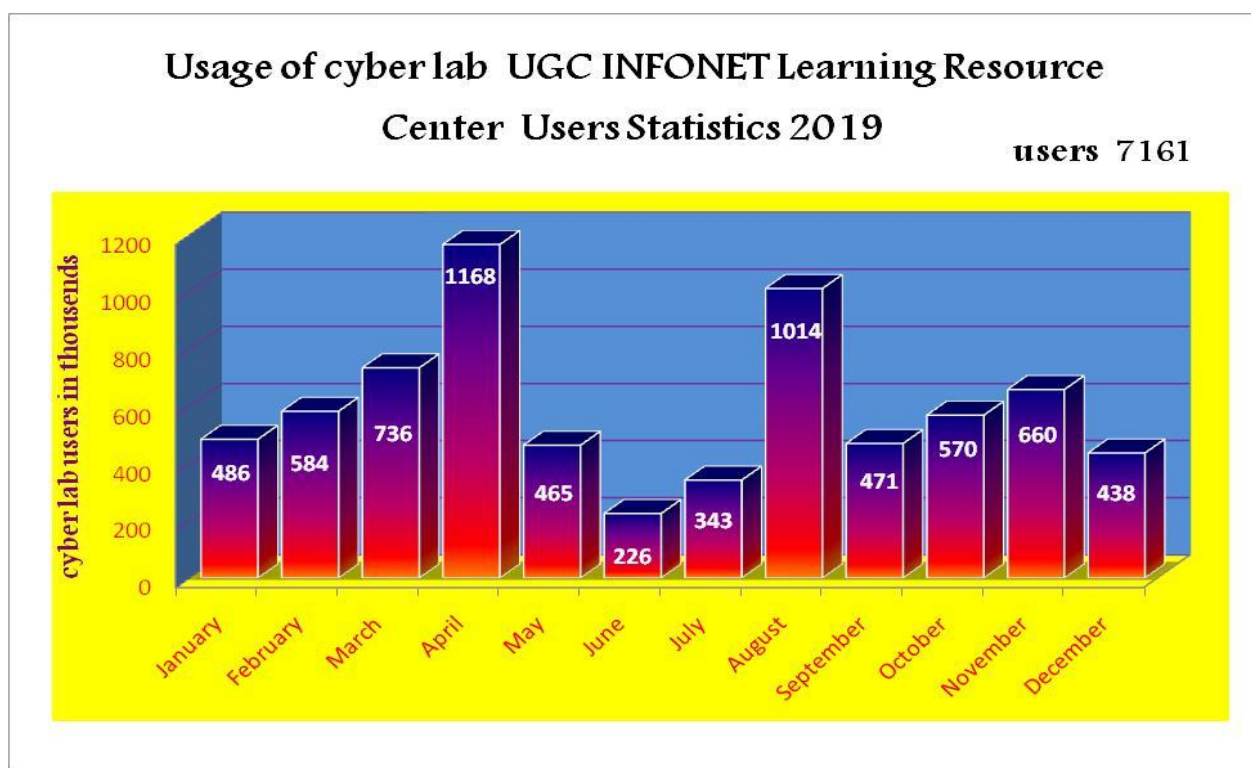

Introduction

- UGC has been assisting the Universities for setting up of Computer Centres since 1990 for research, training and application of computers in every field/subject. Consequently Mangalore University Computer Centre was established in 1990.
- Computer Centre plays a key role in today's knowledge driven society. It provides comprehensive Information Communication technology (ICT) services to Academic/Administrative departments of the university. Its key services includes providing reliable and available ICT infrastructure comprising of computational services and Internet services. Computer Centre maintains reasonably good ICT environment and augments the same from time to time as and when needed. It is also geared up to provide uninterrupted IT services to the end users.
- Cyber Lab is a centralized computational facility comprising of 40 desktop system and application software. The Computer Centre is coming up with another centralized Computer Lab of 80 computers to cater the needs of the facility/students.
- It is very important to be connected to the Internet in today's 'Information Era', Mangalore University providing internet services through two independent Internet service providers (ISPs). One is through NKN with high speed connection of up to 1 Gbps and the other through 35 Mbps leased line from BSNL. Entire campus is configured as a set of Virtual Local area networks (VLAN). The connectivity within the department is extended through CAT5/.CAT6 UTP cabling, while connectivity across the buildings is established through OFC backbone. Core switch at the Computer Centre provides high speed switching required across the campus network. The switch in the Department/Office/Building is used to provide wired connectivity to class rooms / faculty rooms / Labs etc. The internet access is made available to all users through wired Ethernet outlets and Campus wide Wi-Fi (Wireless) facility for authentic users.

Extended use of Internet services by providing **143 LAN I/O points** to the following departments/offices at total cost of **Rs. 7,22,589/-**, under rate contract scheme.

Facilities

1. Computational Facilities

Computer Centre houses mail server and web server, to provide ICT services. These servers are connected to clients in cyber lab and other PG Departments/Offices/Centers. Campus network on OFC interconnects all computers systems in one logical network facilitating services to be utilized from any server on the network. The overall campus network diagram is as shown in Fig.1. Central servers and network services are available round the clock on 24x7 basis.

2. Cyber Lab Facility

Cyber lab is the facility made available to all users. It houses 40 desktop systems with internet connectivity. It also has adequate peripherals such as printers, scanners. Cyber lab is operational from 9.00 AM to 7.00 PM on all working days. Cyber lab utilization for the year under report is shown in Fig 2

3. E-mail Facility

Computer Centre hosts in-house mail server with domain mail. Mangaloreuniversity.ac.in. Web based mail services are available on independent server with open source mailing solution

4. Internet facility

Internet communication is the lifeline in today's connected digital world. University provides Internet facility through two service providers viz. NKN and BSNL. NKN provides full text access to scholarly journals on a 1 Gbps leased line. BSNL provides additional separate 35 Mbps leased line. Gateway level appliance provides firewall services, anti-spam, anti-virus intrusion detection and content filtering services. This ensures secure and safe internet experience to all users. Internet access is available at all departments/offices round the clock on 24x7 basis.

5. IP Phone facility

The Computer Centre also houses the IPPBX appliance (Cisco BE3000) to provide VoIP services through IP phones.

6. Wi-Fi Facility

The solution consists of central controller and access points distributed across the campus. The access points conform to the IEEE standard 802.11 ac, which ensures ideal data transfer speed of 1300Mbps. There are 190 indoor access points deployed to give coverage within the buildings on the campus and 10 outdoor access points to give coverage in open spaces outside the buildings.

All the access points are controlled by central WLAN controller. This controller controls major functions of access points such as authentication, encryption, quality of service etc. This also acts as management console to configure the access points by the administrator. We have provided a redundant controller to ensure high availability, in the event of failure of main controller.

Security is the major concern in Wi-Fi usage. We have ensured adequate security – both for connectivity to Wi-Fi network and to the data transferred over the air. The user is allowed to access only through the registered mobile device, where MAC id of the device shall be the identifying feature. Additionally user has to authenticate using the user name and password assigned to him.

7. CCTV Surveillance System

Closed-circuit television (CCTV) also known as video surveillance, is the use of video cameras to transmit a signal to a specific place, on a limited set of monitors. CCTV camera systems have one or more cameras which are used to send video, images and audio data to a monitor. Essentially, these camera systems use cameras to transmit the signals to a main hub which then records that data for later viewing or live viewing, if you have full time security personnel on the premises.

There are totally 147 cameras of different types installed in the Campus, covering most of the area of the University. An expert engineer is available in the campus for maintaining the setup. The total setup is being maintained by AMC Contract which will be renewed every year through government e-procurement procedure.

The setup has a capacity of storing the footage for the period of recent past 30 days of recording. Which can be viewed or the footage of particular time slot can be copied separately if required. The separate networking setup including the network tower, wireless RF based connectivity has been established for the CCTV and Surveillance System, hence it is not affecting the regular internet of the campus. The main control of the entire setup is hosted in the Computer Centre.

Services

The Computer Centre extends its services in the following areas:

- Software Development and / Implementation.
- Technical Consultancy Services for Hardware, Software procurement and deployment.
- Computer Training Programs as and when needed.
- Data Processing.

 - ❖ Providing Wi-Fi Campus Networking.
 - ❖ Providing CCTV Surveillance System.
