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FOREWORD

I am very delighted to present the Annual Report of our University for the year 2020-21. Over 41 years, Mangalore University has grown in stature and is recognized as one of the premier Universities in the country.

Our University has been known for its commitment to teaching, research, conducting academic programmes and examinations as per schedule. We have the Credit Based Semester System at the undergraduate and the Choice Based Credit System at the postgraduate level. The admission of Research Scholars and foreign students for Ph.D. and P.G. programmes on the campus has increased considerably due to several academic and administrative initiatives taken in recent years.

Our teaching faculty have rendered themselves creditably in their teaching and research activities. Year by year, the H-index of the University is steadily progressing and currently it is 74 that clearly shows research output rendered by our faculty members and research scholars. The research programmes are strengthened through the Research and Consultancy Promotion Cell. Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) Post Graduate students and Research Scholars are provided with laptop under SCP/TSP grants apart from giving them additional books in the library for their studies. The University has introduced several welfare programmes for SC/ST students under SCP-TSP grants sanctioned by the Government. The University has appointed a few more leading academicians from India and abroad as Adjunct Professors, to make use their knowledge and expertise for further excellence. Further, Visiting Professor, Guest Lecturers and temporary non-teaching staff were appointed on need basis for the smooth functioning of the university in terms of both teaching and non-teaching. Guest lecturers have been selected based on their merits, experience and academic excellence following the social justice to all communities. I am happy to note that many of our guest lecturers are NET or K-SET qualified and some of them are Ph.D holders.

The basic facilities available on the campus include Administrative building, Faculty Buildings, Library, Men's, Women's and Working Women's hostels, Staff Quarters, Guest Houses, Mangala Auditorium, well-equipped outpatient health centre, sports facilities including gymnasium, indoor stadium and play grounds with 400 mtr. track. The University has its own water supply arrangement on the campus including harvested rainwater. Other facilities like Banking with four ATMs, Cyber Café, Infilbnet and Postal services are available on the campus. CCTV surveillance systems that have been installed on the campus and in our constituent colleges are very helpful to monitor the activities 24x7. We have given much importance to implement environmental-friendly systems, including installation of solar water heaters, solar-energy powered street lights and replacement of CFL bulbs with LED lighting.

Mangalore University has WiFi connectivity on the campus which is very useful for e-Governance, to make use of e-Office for effectively implementation file managemetn system provided by Govt of

Karnataka.

Information Kiosks and Digital Signage boards that were installed on the campus and in our constituent colleges enabling students and general public to get the information and visualize the events from their locations. The library has 2,20,426 books and subscription to over 305 periodicals, On-line Journals/databases (06), Online Bibliographical database (02) and 15,000+ online journals from UGC-INFONET and 45,000+ online journals from J-gate Database.

The University has advanced science research facilities, viz., Microtron Centre, Centre for Application of Radioisotopes and Radiation Technology (CARRT), Promotion of University Research and Scientific Excellence (PURSE), Centre for Advanced Research in Environment Radio Activity (CARER), OASTC and others.

The University maintains a close liaison with the public of the Coastal region and Kodagu through various outreach programmes including University-Industry interaction, extension activities through, School adoption programme, Mangala Yojane (Village adoption programme), Prasaranga, NSS and various Endowment Chairs and Study Centres.

The University provides scholarships for meritorious students. There are other endowment scholarships also for the meritorious but poor students. Mangalore University has contributed in developing sports in the state through the affiliated colleges. At the Inter-University level, we have produced more than 100 internationals who have brought laurels to the country by winning medals at different levels. The University has introduced sports scholarships to talented sports persons. Incentives to Inter-University new record creators and incentives to All-India Inter-University medalists are given every year.

We have taken all efforts to develop the P.G. Centre at Chikka Aluvara, Kushalnagara. We have established the First Grade College at Mangalagangothri to cater to the higher educational needs of the local people and also started the Evening College at University College, Mangaluru to help the poor students to continue their studies while working at day time. Our constituent colleges such as University College, Mangaluru and Field Marshal K.M. Cariappa College, Madikeri are recognized by the U.G.C. as College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) for five years. University College, Mangaluru has been considered under the scheme of Special Heritage status and received a special grant of Rs.183.00 lakhs from the UGC for restoration of Ravindra Kala Bhavana.

The University provides a safe and peaceful environment that is conducive to learning with the active support of students, faculty, administrative staff, and the various authorities.

2. University Authorities:

a. Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Challenges (SWOC) analyses made and action taken:

❖ Strengths:

- The University is accredited by NAAC.
- Excellent research facilities developed through funding from, DST – PURSE, DST-FIST, UGC SAP, DAE – BRNS, BRIT, DST-SERB, ICMR, KSCST, DBT, ICSSR, etc.,
- Exposure of faculty to international laboratories/research centres through various International fellowships and MOU's
- Well developed, spacious library with ICT, e-resources facilities.
- Computer Centre with mail, web and application servers.
- Sports facilities like gymnasium, indoor stadium, play grounds, outdoor stadium with 400 metres track.
- Directorate of Correspondence to provide higher educational facilities.
- Training of SC/ST/OBC students for competitive examinations, such as UGC/CSIR/CIVIL SERVICE/ ICAS, etc.

- Prasaranga, study centres and peetas are engaged in spreading knowledge to the society and researching on the issues/ problems related to culture, women, weaker sections of the society, etc.
- Extension of consultancy services.
- Promptness in administrative procedures.

❖ **Weaknesses:**

- Inadequate Teaching and non teaching staffs.
- Limited grants for cutting edge research.
- Lack of inter-disciplinary / multi-disciplinary approaches.
- Inadequacy of resources to introduce ambitious academic programs.

❖ **Opportunities:**

- The University has already initiated industry interactions for the academic programs and placements which will be helpful in developing the partnership with industries.
- Syllabi of many courses are framed in consultation with industries which provide job opportunities to our students.
- University has a few National facilities for research which can be extended to other institutions and Universities for collaborative research.
- Various coordinated research programs, Faculty exchange programs with foreign Universities to facilitate frontline research activities. This makes provision for sharing of intellectual properties.
- Exploitation of research potentials to generate revenues in the form of strategic consultancy.
- Increase the access by strengthening distance education programme and adoption of information and communication technologies more effectively.
- The location of the University in the foot hills of the Western Ghats and Coastal Region will be a great opportunity to research on Biodiversity and Conservation.
- The scope for extension of consultancy services.
- Faculty exposure to international laboratories/institutions will be useful to take up high end research and teaching.
- Enhancement of equity initiatives

❖ **Challenges:**

- Increased competition, due to establishment of private and public universities around the campus.
- Limited financial support from State / Central Governments.
- Increased privatization of higher education.
- Inadequate amenities for marginalized section to increase the enrolment.
- Entry of foreign universities to higher education.

b. Short term and long term perspective plans- administrative measures taken, Training to the non-teaching staff:

- To increase the ability of the University to realize the potentiality to compete with institutions of excellence at the global level.
- To enhance the quality of teaching-learning process.
- To increase the access to higher education for the socio-economically backward, SC/ST/OBC community people.

- To increase the enrolment ratio in the University.
 - To promote, acquire and access a cutting edge technical know –how/skills for the improvement of research ability of the scholars in the University.
 - To enhance the employability of the students through value added education.
 - To expand existing and to create additional Physical, Academic and Research infrastructure to increase the enrolment.
 - To enhance the consultancy activities to generate revenues.
- c. Administrative and academic reforms ushered in – based on NAAC Peer Team recommendations and Administrative and Academic Audit (AAA) Committee reports (copies of recommendations/reports may be annexed):
The NAAC committee report and AAA reports
- Efforts are being made in order to provide academic autonomy and the faculty members are encouraged to participate actively in academic activities such as conference organization, participation and also to execute R&D projects of national importance.
 - University is making prompt efforts for appointing qualified faculty where there is an acute shortage. Eminent scholars working in industry/abroad/institutes of national importance are given invitations to work as Adjunct Professors and thereby creating a conducive environment for academic development.
 - The teaching and non-teaching staff were given training on IT related concepts so that it is useful to adopt e-governance in the university administration.
 - Efforts are being made to reduce the surplus generation of materials.
 - The research policy is developed to address the issues related to utilization of equipment available in central facilities
 - Adoption of e-governance in the administration is taking up swiftly.
 - Chairs are made active by providing financial support from the university to organize workshops conferences and as well as to carry out research works.
 - Efforts are being to have green audit and university has got 3rd place at all India level during 2018-19 and 2nd place during 2019-20.
 - The incubation center is established with the support of IBM, Bangalore and efforts are being made to provide knowledge in the recent fields such as Internet of Things, Artificial Intelligence, Machine Learning, Business Intelligence etc.
- d. Administrative measures for networking and development of PG centers/additional campuses, on par with main campus:
- Jnana Kaveri Post Graduate Centre of Mangalore University is situated in Chikka Aluvara, Somawarpet Taluk, Kodagu district. The Director-incharge is appointed to liaison with the main campus.
 - In January 2014, MSc Biochemistry and MSc Microbiology were shifted from FMKMC College, Madikeri to Jnana Kaveri PG Centre, Chikka Aluvara.
 - In August 2014, M.Com and MSW courses commenced with the admission of 30 and 12 students respectively.
 - In August 2015, MA Kannada, MA History, MA Political Science courses were started with 13, 10 and 12 students respectively.

- In August 2017, MSc Botany, MSc Chemistry and MSc Computer Science courses were started with 07, 16 and 05 students respectively.
 - MSc in Environmental Science and MA in Mass Communication & Journalism courses have been approved by the University.
 - Altogether there are 12 approved courses at Jnana Kaveri PG Centre.
 - Video conferencing facility has been created in order to have day to day interaction and surveillance system is developed to monitor the activities
 - Syndicate meetings are being conducted at Jnana Kaveri campus occasionally
- e. Promotion of impact driven and socially relevant research (Ph.D. topics, projects proposed to funding agencies, research publications, inter-disciplinary research and extension) activities:

Under different faculties, our university has focused on diversified research areas which are socially relevant to the Mangalore University region and also to promote interdisciplinary research works. The research work envisage carrying out research of international standard on some of the frontier areas considering the geographical and social needs in the interest of the region in particular, and state and nation at large. The following aspects will cover the core areas of research.

- **Thriving Marine economy and ecosystem:** The coastal region in which the University is located hosts the state's only major port and has a thriving marine economy, and marine resources constitute major chunk of region's revenue and employment base. Considering the significance of sea to the region Mangalore University has established the Department of Marine Geology, adding now the Departments of Geography and Geo-informatics. Coastal regulation act, erosion of the coast and its impact, pollution at sea and coast, quality and related issues of water flow into the sea are just some of the areas of research in the University that now could be based for global knowledge linkages.
- **Indian Ocean Studies:** Being in the southern tip of India, Mangalore University is ideally located for Indian Ocean Studies. Indian Ocean has increasingly acquired commercial and security significance and in the background of increased foreign power presence in the region. Increased piracy, large cargo and oil movements, pollution related issues, cooperative structures among Indian Ocean Rim countries, Sagar Kavacha initiatives of Indian government, instability and turmoil in the Island countries of Indian ocean and military bases of foreign powers have made Indian ocean an extremely important area and has drawn the global attention. Mangalore university wishes to be a centre for such global studies on Indian Ocean with due emphasis on coastal security.
- **Local culture, folklore and expressive forms:** The region has a healthy mix of all religions. People speak different languages and the prominent ones are Tulu, Konkani and Byari besides Kannada and its variants (Arekannada, Kundapura Kannada etc).The local culture, folklore and expressive forms such as Yakshagana, Kambla, Nagaradhane, Bhootaradhane, and Padhana etc make the region distinct and University acts as a center for the study of these distinctive culture. University has also started a Yakshagana Research Centre, Ratnakaravarnic Jain Study Centre,

Tulu Adhyayana Peeta, Shivaram Karantha Peeta etc to promote research in local culture besides the works of the departments like Kannada, Sociology, History that has been attracting significant foreign institutions. Many researchers from Japan, Germany and Finland etc have done substantial research work on local cultures supported by Mangalore University. Siri Mahakavya Sangraha, that is collection and study of oral tradition, for instance, is a collaborative work between Mangalore University and Turku University, Finland and more of such works are under pipeline.

- **Community based organizations and private initiatives:** The region is known for private initiatives (less dependence on government) and many community organisations based on religion, community and profession have been rendering social services, interestingly across communities making the region distinct. These organisations have enabled political mobilization, increased literacy rate, provides health care facilities, and extended banking reach and financial inclusion. This drive by the community organization is typical of the region and potential for global study.
- **Rural development:** The rural development pattern is distinct again in terms of private initiatives and success stories of initiatives like Sri Kshetra Dharmasthala Rural Development Project (SKDRDP) and Siri Gramodyoga that has transformed the nature of rural area. The rural areas were successful in Total Sanitation Campaigns (TSC), quality schools, better health services, good banking and cooperative banks that makes region distinct. Most of these are the results of local initiatives and community supported activities.
- **Community studies and ethnicity:** The region has distinct tribes and communities with their own cultural practices and their study is a fertile area for research. Kodavas, for instance, have community sports practices that make them distinct and many communities have typical spirit worship customs and practices that again has been drawing the attention of scholars. The community studies offer scope for greater collaborative global research.

The frontier areas of research works in science and technology include the following:

The university falls under the coastal areas of Karnataka and has got an easy access to the unique Western Ghats. Western Ghat flora is known for long time to be legendary source of herbal plants with medicinal values. Some of the advanced research works will focus on characterization, drug development and improvement of the plant products for a variety of indications of human and animal populations. These include Bioprospecting conservation in the core areas of research. In addition, important emerging areas like Nanotechnology, Drug Design and Development, Radiation Biophysics, Solar Energy and Solid Waste Utilisation have been included within Core areas of research.

The core activities of research addresses the following areas:

- Western Ghats ecosystem- analysis, conservation and protection of endangered flora and fauna.
- Research and development of plant based drugs for various indications.
- Research and Development of drugs and delivery systems and remedial technologies to alleviate chronic infectious diseases.
- Advanced materials and devices using Nanotechnology
- Improved flora of the Western Ghats of the coastal Karnataka region, soil health and soil mapping.
- Cataloguing, mapping and bar coding of plant diversity.

- DNA Finger Printing of selected / endangered flora.
- Commercializing Orchid culture and preservation using nanotechnology.
- High throughput production of viral free plants through tissue culture for rapid propagation.
- Multiplication and conservation of endemic and endangered plant species.
- Collaborating with other institutions through interdisciplinary research and industry–academia interactions.

f. Promotion of excellence in higher education:

- International and National conferences were conducted by the University.
- In last year, five MOUs with international institutes have been signed for collaborative programmes and research.
- To motivate the young researchers and students, over 35 senior academicians and researchers have been appointed as Adjunct Professors to various departments. The University has adopted 'Back to roots' initiative and brought good teachers and research scholars working abroad in reputed Universities to Mangalore University.

Initiatives taken to promote overall development of the university:

- The facilities at the research centres and PURSE labs are extended to researchers to strengthen ongoing research activities in frontline areas of science and technology.
- The University has started new UG as well as PG courses in accordance with changing trends in higher education. A new college on the Mangalagangothri campus is offering BA, BBA and BCom courses. The university also has opened an Evening college at the University College, Mangalore premises to cater to the educational requirements of the working class in the city. The university has initiated action to start LLM programme.
- *Technological Initiatives:* The University campus is a 24X7 Wi-Fi enabled campus for the stakeholders. The University offices are made paperless offices by providing a computer to all the non-teaching staff. The university has also adopted e-governance initiatives of the Govt. of Karnataka. ICT has become an integral part of teaching and learning program of the university. All the faculty members have been provided with laptops so that they can utilize all possible e-resources for effective teaching. The SC/ST research scholars and PG Students are provided with laptops under SCP/TSP grants apart from giving them extra books in the library for their studies. The Library has a cyber-lab for online reference of books and journals. Remote access has also been provided for the users to see the online resources in the library from anywhere anytime. Anti-plagiarism software has been installed in the library so that all researchers can check their articles and thesis for plagiarism and improve upon the quality of publications. CCTV cameras have been installed in the entire campus for proper surveillance.
- *Green Initiatives:* Most of the Science department laboratories are converted into modular laboratories by using anti-rust, anti corrosion and other suitable materials for arrangement of equipment in the laboratories. A vermi-compost plant for waste Management has been started to utilize the waste on the campus. A solid waste management plant has been initiated in collaboration with the Zilla

Panchayat to help villages in maintenance of waste. A campus cleaning programme has been started in which all faculty and students are involved in cleaning the campus on third Saturday of every month. Installation of Solar energy systems and Rain water harvesting has been completed. All street lights on the campus are converted to LED lighting so that power can be saved and utilized in a better way.

- *Other Initiatives:* An important initiative of introducing Mangalore University to the International community and bringing International Students to the University for educational purpose. We now have about 140 international students on our campus pursuing study for their UG, PG and PhD degrees.

The achievers in Sports and Cultural activities from the Alumni of the University are felicitated every year on the Foundation Day. Encouragement is being provided to sports through formulation of sports policy and providing fellowships to sportsmen for higher education. Information Kiosks and Digital Signage boards are installed on the campus and constituent colleges so that students can get information from the University and watch the programmes in the University. Village adoption programmes are initiated under the banner “MANGALA YOJANE” - taking the University to the Village to help villages to develop on all fronts.

g. Welfare measures for SC/ST/OBC/Women/Divyangj and others:

Several welfare measures have been provided to SC/ST/OBC/Women/Divynag and others community. The following cells have been strengthened and are aimed to provide the needed facilities to the student community:

SC/ST Cell

- A special Cell for the welfare of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes in Mangalore University has come into existence for effective implementation of the programmes and policies of reservation. The Cell is advised by a Standing Committee on various policy matters pertaining to academic and non academic matters under the Chairmanship of the Vice-Chancellor.
- The Cell awards SC/ST research fellowships and contingency grants to the Ph.D. students. It also extends financial assistance to various programmes such as study tour, preparation of dissertation project reports, purchase of sports kits and computer training. Training programmes for the SC/ST students appearing for UGC/JRF/Lectureship examinations, facilities awareness programme, career guidance and personality development programmes are also conducted.
- A database of the SC/ST students studying in the affiliated colleges of Mangalore University and Post Graduate departments of Mangalore University is maintained in the SC/ST Cell.
- SC/ST Cell is in charge of getting scholarships, EBL charges of the hostel inmates and reimbursement of fees from the Government for SC/ST students studying in the Post Graduate departments.

The following are the activities of SC/ST Cell during the year 2020-21

The SC/ST Cell in Mangalore University is functioning well with the cooperation of Special Officer and other supporting staff. Dr. Puttanna K, Professor, Department of MBA is the Special Officer of SC ST Cell. The annual budget during 2020-21, **Rs.2,50,00,000.00 (Rupees Two Crores Fifty Lakhs only)** has been earmarked under budget code 1434 as the Amelioration fund for the welfare of SC/ST students and utilized as follows:

Other activities:-

Under SCP – TSP Grant for the year 2020-21, an amount of Rs.25,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty five lakh only) has been sanctioned and has been paid to UG students/PG Students/Research Scholars.

OBC Cell:

A special Cell for the welfare of Other Backward Classes (OBC) including minorities is established in the university which is headed by a Co-ordinator. The cell is established in 2005.

The welfare measures provided by this cell are as follows:

- To collect reports and information regarding the Government of India and the UGC orders on various aspects of education, training and employment of OBC.
- To circulate Government of India orders and UGC s decisions and to collect information in respect of appointing, training these communities in teaching and non-teaching posts in the University. To help them apply for post within the University a stipulated date and take follow up action where required.
- To collect statistics on OBC students and employees.
- To monitor the working of the remedial coaching scheme in the University for OBC students including minority students.
- To function as a Grievances Redressal cell for the grievances of OBC students including minority students and employees.

Directorate of Student Welfare:

The DSW is primarily a statutory office working for the welfare of students of the campus. It encourages and monitors the extra-curricular activities of the students. The DSW is committed to the spirit of unity and integrity of the students. It was started along with the university but managed initially under the Administrative Officer. From the year 1992 onwards the centre is headed by the Director.

Activities.

Due to COVID 19 pandemic, there was a complete lockdown from 22nd March till end of April 2020. Later students were at home with online classes. In December 2020, students started attending the classes offline. Therefore, programmes were not held initially.

Toastmasters International Club:

Toastmaster Demo Meet was held on 28th January 2021 to show to the University aspirants about its

importance. Mangala Toastmasters Club was initiated on 30th March 2021 with 21 charter members, 16 being the research scholars and post graduate students of Mangalore University. Online meetings are conducted once in a fortnight. This is for the overall development of our postgraduate students, research scholars, guest faculty and also, young faculty of our University to develop leadership quality, improve speaking and listening skills, effective communication, public speaking, to enhance English vocabulary and to learn parliamentary procedures.

Anti-drug awareness programme:

Antidrug awareness programme was held on 1st Feb 2021 at Mangala Auditorium. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Prof. P.S. Yadapadithaya inaugurated the program and the two resource persons Dr. N.S. Raviraja spoke on “**No Excuse for Drug Abuse**” and Dr. P.V. Bhandary delivered a lecture on “**Scientific Treatment of Drug Addiction**”. Dr. Gerald Santhosh D Souza, Director of Physical Education delivered presidential address. An effective skit by the MSW students on anti-drug movement was performed on stage.

Cultural evening on 8th Feb.2021 during NAAC peer team visit:

Around 120 students participated in the cultural programme organized in the honour of the NAAC Peer team. Eight different programmes were planned and exhibited. International students also took part in the programme. It was highly appreciated by the guests and administrators.

Since then, classes are held twice a week for two months.

From the DSW office, all the 209 colleges were being communicated to enquire whether they have installed suggestion boxes in their institutions and displayed important telephone numbers. About 100 Principals have responded positively and explained their facilities.

h. Promotion of Kannada in all its celebrated forms:

- Kannada language is adopted as administrative language
- Lecture series are being regularly arranged in various affiliated colleges to promote Kannada language
- Prasara is entrusted to print Kannada books, novels, research publications and monographs.
- University web-site is re-designed in Kannada.

i. Initiatives to mobilize finances through PPP, alumni/alumnae associations etc.,

- Different chairs are established with the help of individual/organizational donors
- Govt. funded chairs/centres are established

j. Innovative measures to ensure announcement of results before commencement of next semesters of UG and PG degree courses

Mangalore University examination section is continuously progressing by adapting the available latest technology and the best practices. Some of the innovative measures are as follows.

- Student data is directly imported from the Online Admission Data
- Exam Registration and the IA marks entry are being done online.
- Examination Admission Cards are issued directly to the colleges through online.
- For valuation, the answer scripts of all the courses are coded.
- The coding of the answer book is done completely automatic by using printers which have the capability of printing codes directly on the answer scripts, hence reduces the mistakes that would happen in manual process.
- Since all marks entries (both theory and practicals) are entered by valuer/examiners, as a result wastage is minimum, such as error in marks cards etc are very minimum.
- During Oct/Nov 2018 Examination, University has introduced a new system of online entry of marks in the valuation centre itself and results were announced within a week of completion of valuation work.
- During April/May 2019 Examination, all practical marks were entering online by the Colleges where practical exams were conducted.

a. Procedures to address intra and inter campus administration:

- Adoption of video conferencing system for day to day activities monitoring
- Regular meetings with Chairpersons, Directors, and Principals
- Onsite visit to the campus departments, PG centre and colleges on need basis

- Entrusting responsibilities to the Heads of the Department to work as an interface to the administration for smooth functioning of the departments
- Follow-up activities monitoring through discussion on action taken report in the apex body of administration such as Syndicate and Academic Council

b. Measures to address vacancies in administrative/technical/support staff:

- The details of vacancies available under both Teaching and Non-Teaching is uploaded in the UGC web-site.
- Measures have been taken to fill-up the teaching staff vacancies (Backlog and Hyderabad-Karnataka vacancies) and the details are sent to KEA as per the Higher Education Department orders.
- Adjunct Professor, Visiting Professor, Guest faculty and temporary non-teaching staff were appointed on need basis for the smooth functioning of the university in terms of both teaching and non-teaching.

c. Campus Security (Main and other campuses):

- Surveillance System is deployed in the Mangalagangothri Campus, PG Centre Chikka Aluvara and University College, Mangaluru.
- The security services have been deployed for 24x7 management of the campuses.

d. Welfare measures for non-teaching and teaching staff:

- University has taken many measures for enhancement of professional competencies of the teaching and non-teaching staff. University encourages faculty members to attend and participate in Orientation programmes, refreshers courses, summer and winter schools, workshops, seminars, conferences and symposia. The University constantly encourages and motivates faculty members to apply for funded research projects offered by different funding agencies and also provide seed money of up to one lakh for junior faculty members to start their research activity and develop basic facilities to carry out research. Inter disciplinary and cross disciplinary research is being promoted by offering seed money of 5 lakhs to researchers from cross border faculty. The study leave will be granted for one year to do Post-Doctoral research abroad through fellowship and also provide sabbatical leave for completing research work. Acknowledging the role of and importance of teachers in the growth of institutes of higher education and to motivate Teacher, University has instituted the Best Teacher Award for university teachers and selected faculty are presented with a citation. The non-teaching staff is also encouraged to attend training programme organized by the University administration as well as other institution.
- The University campus is a self-contained facility that provide all the essential facilities and infrastructure for the pursuit of excellence in higher education. There is an impressive administrative building, two guest houses for visiting dignitaries and faculty, a well-equipped health centre, a useful shopping complex, two nationalized banks, and an ATM centre. There is a post office and a telephone exchange on the campus. The University has provided residential quarters for its employees on the campus itself. On the University campus, there are two hostels for men and women, and a hostel for working women. Solar water heaters have been installed in all hostels. There are playgrounds and

courts, a modern gymnasium, and indoor sports facilities. The employees of the University form themselves the Vishwamangala Education Society which is successfully running a primary school, high school and a Pre-University College on the campus. They also manage an employee cooperative society catering to the needs of employees and students. The university has a health centre, Baby-sitting facilities, and a well-developed English medium school in the campus, Cooperative Credit Society, Walking lawn on double road, 400 metre track gymnasium, a Gift centre and Stationary shops. University also provides Drinking Water facility with water purified system.

- The University conducts periodic training programs on adopting new technologies of ICT to better equip the teachers in use of computer and internet.
- The internet facilities are made available to faculty members, researchers, students and administrators to use information and communication technologies. At the beginning of each academic year, the University prepares and distributes the academic calendar which clearly notifies the commencement and end of all the academic programmes, admission and examination schedules.

5. Constitution of IQAC and its functioning as per UGC Regulations 2010:

In pursuance of the National Action plan of NAAC for performance evaluation, assessment, accreditation and quality upgradation of institutions of higher education, the IQAC was established in the year 2010. As per the spirit of NAAC guidelines, the IQAC has been striving for internalization and institutionalization of quality enhancement. The duties and responsibilities of the Director include:

- Establishment and maintenance of database of the University system since its inception, pertaining to administrative, academic, developmental, financial and examination branches of the University.
- Collection and establishment of details of courses, curriculum, schedule of establishment, CV of all the teachers, growth and strength of PG Departments and Units. Acquiring continuous information and feedback regarding funding from various funding agencies, institutions within and outside the country.
- Disseminating the information regarding funds available from different agencies, guide and assist faculty members in preparing project proposals to be submitted to various funding agencies.
- Co-ordinate with the principal investigators of UGC, DST, DOD, DAE and other sponsored research projects in the smooth conduct and completion of the projects.
- Organising appropriate training modules to the existing staff to record and maintain the database of the University for their routine Work.
- Creation of a directory of scientists / noted educationalists and scientific institutions for interaction of the faculty members and scholars.
- Liaisoning with funding agencies/departments/teachers/scholars to promote collaborative and inter disciplinary academic endeavours.
- Planning and organising meetings of the Planning, Monitoring and Evaluation Board from time to time in consultation with the Vice-Chancellor.
- Organising/Co-ordinating exhibitions, demonstrations, conferences, seminars, special lectures etc. to promote research culture among the faculty members and research scholars.
- Assisting the Vice-Chancellor and the administration in planning, programming and implementation of various developmental activities with adequate facts and figures.

7. Compliance to the directives of the Chancellor/ Government –status report

Honorary Degrees or Other Distinctions:

- If not less than two thirds of the members of the Syndicate recommend that an Honorary degree or other academic distinction be conferred on any person on the ground that he is in its opinion, by reason of eminent attainment and position, fit and proper to receive such degree on the person concerned.
- The Honorary degree or distinction may be conferred only in exceptional cases. It shall not be conferred as a matter of course. Only such of the person who have contributed substantially to the advancement of Literature, Philosophy, Arts, Music, Painting or any other subject assigned to the

Faculty of Arts, Science or Technology or conspicuous service rendered by them to the cause of education shall be identified for the purpose of grant of such Honorary degrees (D.Litt).

- A degree of Doctor of Science & Technology (D.Sc.) Honoris Causa may be conferred upon such persons in the branch of Science or Technology, Planning, Organising or Developing Scientific and Technological Institutions.
- A degree of Doctor of Laws (L.L.D.) Honoris Causa may be conferred upon such persons who are distinguished Lawyers, Judges, Jurists, and Statesmen or have made noteworthy contribution to the cause of the public.
- Honorary degrees shall be conferred only at the Annual Convocation and may be taken in person or in absentia.
- The presentation of persons at the convocation on whom Honorary Degrees are to be conferred shall be made by the Vice-Chancellor.
- The procedure outlined in the Statutes governing the Annual Convocation shall apply Mutatis/Mutandis in the case of conferment of Honorary Degrees also except that in the latter case the recipient of the Honorary degree may be allowed to make a brief address after receiving the degree and be a member of the convocation.
- The Vice-Chancellor may make suitable changes with the prior approval of the Chancellor with regard to the procedure to be followed at convocation when circumstance necessitate.

University Grants Commission (UGC) SPONSORED “The Centre for Study of Social Exclusion and Inclusive Policy (CSSEIP)”, is a new Multi-disciplinary research centre established under UGC XI plan in Mangalore University to carry out research and teaching in the areas of social exclusion, discriminatory studies and inclusive policy. The key objective of the centre is to conceptualise, contextualise and problematise discrimination, exclusion and inclusion based on caste, ethnicity and religion. The centre proposes to focus on developing understanding of the nature and dynamics of exclusion and discrimination at both theoretical and empirical levels. The major functions of the CSSEIP include the following:

- Undertaking research projects to identify various forms and processes of social exclusion and problems of socially excluded groups.
- Publishing research findings on social exclusion and inclusive policies related issues in Journals and books.
- Organizing conferences, seminars and training programmes on the theme of Social Exclusion and Inclusive policies related to marginalized groups.
- Undertaking Ph.D/Post-Doctoral Fellow supervision on the topics of social exclusion, Poverty of Marginalized groups, Livelihood of tribal community etc.,
- Collecting information on discrimination and social exclusion and building up a database and carrying out detailed analyses based on the socio-economic data generated by government agencies.

- Establishing links with civil society organizations to collaborative work.

CBCS Implementation at PG Level:

- The University Grants Commission, New Delhi, has directed all Universities in the country to implement the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS, Semester Scheme) in both the under-graduate and post-graduate programmes and has been issuing a series of guidelines with regard to this. The Higher Education Council, Government of Karnataka, has considered the implementation of CBCS and has organized workshops in this regard. The Choice Based Credit System enables the degrees of Mangalore University to be on par with the global standards.

The Salient Features of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) (Semester Scheme):

- Each course in a programme shall carry certain number of credits, which normally represent the weightage of a course and are a function of teaching, learning and evaluation strategies such as number of contact hours, the course content, teaching methodology, learning expectations, etc. In the proposed programmes, the credits shall be based on the number of instructional hours per week, generally 1 credit is equivalent to one hour of instruction in theory, or 1 or 2 hours of tutorial, or one and a half or two hours of practical/field work /project work / internship per week.

The other features of the CBCS (Semester Scheme) are:

- The P. G. degree programmes are structured on credit based semester scheme.
- The relative importance of subjects of study and activities are quantified in terms of credits. Total credit of the programme is between 84 to 92.
- Each programme of study will have “Core” and “Elective” courses. The Core course will further consist of “Hard” and “Soft” core courses. Hard core courses will have 3-5 credits while soft courses will have 3-4 credits.
- Two or more Open elective courses of 3 credits each shall be offered in the II and III semesters by every Department. Open elective will be chosen from other programmes within the faculty or across the faculty.
- The declaration of result is based on the grade point average (GPA) earned towards the end of each semester and the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) earned towards the end of the programme with corresponding alpha –sign grade.
- Provision has been made for Accumulation of credits if the students have studied in different institutions /Universities by giving them option of leaving out the courses which they have studied earlier and such credits are transferred to their Marks card.
- Any student who has completed the course with a certain number of credits under the MOOC programme is also eligible to get the credits transferred to his mark card issued by our University. Students who have studied in other state (who have not studied CBCS pattern) are allowed to take admission under CBCS by completing the papers /courses which they have studied as per CBCS pattern of our University.
- Provision has been made for the Admission of Diploma holders to III Semester of degree programme is here under;
- A candidate who has passed the three years Polytechnic Diploma Examination as identified by the concerned course / programme Board of Studies and approved by the University may be directly admitted to III Semester of the programme. Such candidates are eligible for grading but not for ranking.
- A Candidate successful at the diploma examination of Secretarial / Commercial practice conducted by the Government of Karnataka may be directly admitted to the III Semester (Second year) B.Com. Degree programme. Such candidates are eligible for grading but not for ranking.

p. Placement Cell and Campus Recruitment

- The University Employment Information and Guidance Bureau (UEIGB) at Mangalagangothri is functioning at University campus offering services since 30 Years. A State Government officer of the rank of group a gazette who is designated as Deputy Chief will be functional head and carries all functions of the Bureau. He will be an officer of the department of Employment and Training.
- **Career talks and conferences at affiliated colleges:**
 - ❖ The Deputy Chief, along with his staff will visit the affiliated colleges and address the students. e. Time taken for adjudication and declaration of the results of Ph.D.theses/M.Phil Dissertations.
An examiner who has accepted the assignment of evaluating a thesis, is given a time period of two months to read the thesis, evaluate it and send the report.

f. Ph.D. course work examination procedures.

After having been admitted, every Ph.D student shall be required by the University/Institution College, as the case may be, to undertake course work for a minimum period of one Semester (Six months duration). However, M.Phil Degree holders are exempted from course work. The Course on research methodology may include quantitative methods and computer applications, reviewing of published research in the relevant field as prescribed by the concerned Board of studies as per the guidelines framed by the University.

The report of course work shall be referred to the Doctoral Committee headed by the Chair man of the concerned Board of Studies and one external member for opinion. The Doctoral

Committee shall consider the report and approve it as such, or approve with suggestions or modifications if any, or ask for a fresh course work. The Chairperson of the Doctoral Committee shall communicate the opinion of the Committee to the Registrar within two months. Candidates working under Recognized Research Centres shall forward the report of course work directly to the Chairman of the concerned Doctoral Committee.

- g. Policy for procurement of examination related materials such as answer books, marks cards, degree certificates, rank certificates, provisional certificates.

Answer booklets were procured by outsourced firm and marks card degree certificate/ rank certificates, provisional certificates will be procured as per government procurement rules (e-tender)

Padmashri Dr. Sudha Murthy, Chairperson, Infosys Foundation, Bengaluru has delivered the 39th Annual Convocation address in online mode on April 10, 2021.

39th Convocation Welcome address / Vice Chancellor report

Honorary chancellor, Chief Guest Padmashri Dr. Sudha Murthy, Chairperson, Infosys Foundation, Members of the Syndicate and Academic Council, Officers and Staff of the University, Faculty and Students, Parents and Guardians, Heads of management of various institutions, Distinguished invitees, Members of the press and media fraternity, and most importantly, my dear young graduates, Mangalore University was established on September

10, 1980, as an offshoot of the University of Mysore with a dream of becoming a 'University with a difference'. Over the past 41 years, Mangalore University has grown in stature and earned a respectable position among the higher educational institutions in the country. We have achieved greater strides in terms of infrastructure development, the introduction of new academic programs, research publications and projects, outreach activities, improved student well-being and learning experiences. We promise to continue and build on the best practices and good traditions established by the previous eight Vice Chancellors and to introduce new initiatives demanded by the changing circumstances and the expectations of our stakeholders. We are marching towards excellence with a philosophy of 'continuity with change'.

We are committed and dedicated to providing student-centric, public-friendly academic and administrative governance with a view to winning the hearts and minds of our internal and external stakeholders. Our teaching faculty members have rendered themselves creditably in their teaching and research activities. We have got a vibrant, active, supportive, registered alumni association called, Mangala Alumni Association (MAA) – the only campus-wide registered alumni association in Karnataka. We adopt a democratic, participative, inclusive and consultative approach in discharging transparency and accountability in governance. The University has a formal mechanism to obtain feedback from students regarding curriculum content, the effectiveness of teaching and evaluation. The University has undertaken quality sustenance and quality enhancement measures such as the inclusion of emerging thrust areas, periodic curriculum revision and introduction of inter-disciplinary and innovative schemes in thrust areas.

The two major developmental focuses that are being effectively implemented include eco-friendly campus and paperless office through e-governance. The University has built international collaborations with many institutions in different countries of the world making this one of the leading universities in India. It is also one of the most preferred universities for higher Education by International students. Currently, over 150 international students from 38 countries are pursuing their higher studies on the campus. Despite the challenges of COVID year, we have already received 75 applications this year and more are coming in.

The new initiatives that have been successfully brought into action in 2020-21 include the construction of 'Shahid Sthal' as a mark of respect to our martyrs; online-offline-experiential learning support system; outdoor learning centres for promoting learning beyond the four walls; Professorial lecture series by our experienced faculty; experience-sharing sessions by the alumni and industry experts; student-teaching practice; encouraging the students to opt for MOOC under SWAYAM platform; timely conduct of examinations and timely announcement of error-free results, effective implementation of e-office; revision of syllabi giving more emphasis for practically-oriented learning to make the curriculum responsive to the needs of the society; training the non-teaching staff in soft and technical skills; bringing out of research policy; gender policy and gender champions; new academic programs like M.Sc. in Cyber Security; Establishment of Research, Development, Consultancy and Patent Cell (RDCPC); and special campus recruitment drive; rejuvenating Cultural museum showcasing the rich heritage of Tulunadu; publication of

academic books through Prasaraṅga in Kannada, English and Tulu authored by eminent scholars; launching of Office of Research Integrity (ORI) to provide institutional support and structure for creating and sustaining a culture of honesty and ethical research practice; the opening of Swami Vivekananda Study Centre in collaboration with Ramkrishna Mission; launching of innovation facilitation centre under the auspices of The National Research Development Corporation (NRDC); plantation drive of fruit-yielding saplings in and around the campus, conducting of various skill-based training programs under Aatma Nirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan enabling the general public to become self-reliant; Awareness programs in collaboration with local police departments and other institutions to educate students on drugs and other narcotics against victims of ill-treatment and social abuse. Promotion of eligible faculty members under career advancement scheme (CAS), and non-teaching staff based on their seniority; Training and placement cell and Release of the Good Academic Research Practices.

Some of our initiatives reflecting the institutional social responsibility undertaken recently received appreciation from all corners such as village adoption, adopting 10 government schools in the neighbourhood under the Education Reforms – Govt of Karnataka, Construction of Vatsalya Nidhi (Wall of Kindness) a place for charity work encouraging people to donate miscellaneous useful things; construction and maintenance of public restroom facility sponsored by the Bank of Baroda under Corporate Social Responsibility, the mid-day meal scheme for the poorest of poor students on the campus. Our community engagement is guided by the philosophy of ‘taking the University to the villages’ and the active involvement, support, and commitment of NSS, Youth Red Cross, NGOs and our Study Centres and Chairs.

On the other hand, some of the proposed plans that are in the pipeline to be implemented are outdoor learning center on the campus; setting up of a business lab, centralized language lab and a full-fledged computer lab in each academic block; Establishing Dr. V. S. Acharya Centre for Coastal Development Studies; providing 24x7 ventilated ambulance facility on the campus; Upgradation of solar energy for self-sustaining power supply on the campus. Launching of ‘**student adalats**’ in each of the three districts (Kodagu, Udupi and Dakshina Kannada) for direct interaction with students; University-sponsored research fellowships for economically weaker OBC and General Category students; basketball court and swimming pool; twinning programs, faculty & student exchange programs through foreign collaboration; modernizing the University canteen into the food court and providing food at subsidized rate; filling-up of vacant teaching and non-teaching positions; augmenting of internal resources through tapping of CSR funds, alumni support and public-private partnerships. Revising of examination manual and publication; Launching of group insurance for the benefit of the students in case of health and emergency situations; Implementation of zero waste campus management in association with Ramakrishna Mission – Swacch Mangaluru Abhiyan; Sewage treatment plant for the boy’s hostel; taking rainwater harvesting to the next level; construction of a building to house the Brahmasri Narayana Guru Study Chair and Pareeksha Bhawana.

The University has over 50 ongoing research projects funded by UGC, BRNS, DST, NPCL, MoES, and ICSSR, etc. The total grants sanctioned for these projects during 2014-20 amounts to over

20 crores (INR 2063 lakhs). As a result of it the University has achieved SCOPUS H-Index of 72 on date. Several departments have entered into MOUs and hosted many researchers from reputed institutions. Under Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA), a new campus for Advanced Science Research cum PG Centre is being established at Belapu, Udupi District. The centre is intended to carry out need-based research on various local issues with special reference to conservation of Western Ghats species, developing medicine for communicable diseases and using nano-technology for developing devices for cancer treatment. It will also house some teaching departments as a nucleus for a PG centre in the Udupi district in due course.

It is a proud feeling to mention that the University is honoured with the Karnataka Kreedha Poshak Award: 2019-20 by the Department of Youth Empowerment and Sports – Govt of Karnataka, in recognition of promoting sports activities and for producing national and international level sportspersons. The University stands No. 1 among the Indian Universities and 139th position at the global level in the UI Green Metric World Ranking, 2020. The credit goes to all those who have contributed to achieving excellence.

Despite the crucial situation of the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020-21, it is well appreciated that various departments on the campus, PG centres and our constituent colleges have successfully conducted meaningful events, including seminars, conferences, workshops, observing special days, awareness campaign, training and orientation programs, online, offline and in blended mode.

In the critical situation of COVID-19 pandemic, in addition to strictly following the SOPs, the University has taken many initiatives and steps; the most important ones include, constituting a COVID-19 cell in the University for the needful services; conducting COVID-19 testing on camps for university employees and students; extending the technical support with Wenlock District Hospital, Mangaluru for Setting of COVID-19 test lab; distribution of grocery kits to the doorsteps of poor people and daily-wage workers during the lockdown period, distribution of cooked food for stranded 160 labourers at Thokkottu twice a week; extending helping hands with the district administration by providing university hostels to serve as isolation units; submission of an innovative idea for drug development, to the COVID-19 solution challenge – Govt of India; motivational talks and interviews by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor through FM radio, news channels and face book, during the lockdown period; timely publication of educative articles on COVID-19 for general public; street play performance to create awareness on corona virus and safety measures; Awareness talks by few faculty members; conducting of special examinations across India and abroad; arrangements for far-away students enabling them to attend the examinations in their nearby localities not only within India but also for foreign students outside the countries; participation and giving constructive suggestions in the meetings (online and offline) conducted by the Department of Higher Education – Govt of Karnataka and UGC.

I take this opportunity to present the data of the candidates who have appeared and successfully completed the degrees for the year 2020-21: Doctor of Philosophy 117 (of which ; Faculty of Arts 27, Faculty of Science 63, Faculty of Commerce 14, and, Faculty of Education 13), Out of 5,300

candidates appeared for Post-Graduate examinations, 5,069 have passed the examinations (95.64%); out of 1,357 Post-Graduate students appeared for examinations in autonomous institutions 1,328 have passed (97.86%); out of 33,464 Under-Graduate candidates appeared, 24,472 passed (73.13%); out of 3,476 Under-Graduate candidates appeared in autonomous institutions, 2,791 passed (80.29%); out of 29 candidates appeared for Post-Graduate Diploma examinations, 29 have passed (100%). I am proud to inform you that 10 students have been conferred upon with gold medals and 101 students have been conferred with cash prizes for their outstanding academic performance.

In today's 39th Convocation, in view of COVID-19 situation only Ph.D. candidates, Gold Medalists and First Rank holders will receive their degrees in person. 101 cash prizes will be sent through cheque by post to the students. I wish all the students great success and a sense of achievement in all their future endeavours.

Now let me introduce Padmashri awardee Dr. Sudha Murty, Chairperson, Infosys Foundation, Bengaluru, who is going to deliver 39th Annual Convocation address in a short while from now.

Dr. Sudha Murty was born in 1950 in Shiggaon, Haveri District in North Karnataka. She completed her engineering from BVB College of Engineering, obtained 1st rank across all branches and received a gold medal from the Institute of Engineers. She did her ME from Indian Institute of Science with distinction and started her career as an engineer with TELCO (now Tata Motors). Today, she is the chairperson of Infosys Foundation and has handled 16 national disasters in the last 24 years. She studied in a Kannada-medium school till 10th standard and fell in love with the language. Her strong ties to the language and its people led her to establish more than 60,000 libraries in Karnataka. She also strongly believes in creating awareness for social causes and has passionately travelled the world for this purpose including universities and gatherings in USA, Columbia, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, Pakistan, New Zealand, Australia, England, Thailand, Vietnam, China, Tibet, and Singapore. A prolific writer in English and Kannada, her books have been translated into all major Indian languages and have sold over 30 lakh copies around the country. She is a columnist for English and Kannada dailies with 30 books and more than 200 titles to her credit – including novels, non-fiction, children's books, travelogues, technical books, and memoirs. She has also received nine honorary doctorates. Some of her awards include the R.K. Narayan Award for Literature, the Padma Shri in 2006, the Attimabbe Award from the Government of Karnataka for excellence in Kannada literature in 2011, the Lifetime Achievement by Crossword Book Awards in 2018 and more recently, the Lal Bahadur Shastri National Award for Excellence in 2020. She lives by the belief that "Generosity of a few is hope for millions".

d. Statute Governing Establishment of Fellowships, Scholarships, Gold Medals etc.

(Framed under Sec, 40(1) (h) read with Sec 29(2) ® of the KSU Act 2000)

1. Title and Commencement
 - This Statute shall be called “the Statute governing establishment of Fellowships, Scholarships, and Gold Medals etc”.
 - This Statute shall come into force from the date of assent of this Chancellor.
2. The Syndicate may, in consultation with the appropriate authorities of the University. Institute Fellowships, Travelling Fellowships, Scholarships, Studentships, Stipends, Medals, Prizes etc. out of the endowments donations/funds instituted on this behalf.
3. No Scholarship, Prize or Medal shall be instituted and awarded on the basis of religion, caste or community or institution.
4. A proposal for the institution of Fellowships, Endowment Lectures, Scholarships, Studentships, Stipends, Medals and Prizes by an individual or body shall be made to the Registrar in writing accompanied by a Cheque or Bank Draft in favour of the Registrar or a Bank Challan for having credited the amount to the University Funds together with a copy of the terms of award proposed by the donors.
5. Following shall be the minimum amount to be donated by the donors for instituting an endowment in the University or the amount as revised by the University from time to time.
 - i) For awarding a fellowship or travelling fellowship Rs. 1,00,000/-
 - ii) For awarding a Scholarship/Studentship/Stipend Rs. 50,000/-
 - iii) For awarding a Gold Medal Rs. 1,00,000/-
 - iv) For awarding a Cash Prize Rs. 25,000/-
6. When a proposal for instituting a fellowship, travelling fellowship, scholarship, studentship, stipend, medal and prize is received, the Academic Council shall be consulted regarding the terms of award and the proposal along with the recommendation of the Academic Council thereon shall be placed before the Syndicate and Finance Committee for approval.
7. The Syndicate may accept such a proposal with such modification as it may deem it necessary with regard to the conditions made in the proposal.
8. The donor shall enter into an agreement with the University regarding the conditions of award as approved by the Syndicate.
9. The University shall invest the money endowed in Government securities as it may deem fit and award fellowships, scholarships, medals, prizes etc., out of the interest accrued thereon. If in any year no medal or prize is awarded the Interest accrued thereon shall be added to the corpus of the awarded at a Convocation held before completion of one year from the date of acceptance of the endowment the donor may pay to the University separately the actual cost of such medal or prize.
10. The Syndicate shall have power to award a cash prize whenever the interest out of the endowment is not sufficient for award of Gold Medal.

11. The medals and prizes shall ordinarily be awarded at the Annual Convocation of the University.
 12. The existing Fellowships, Travelling Fellowships, Stipends, Medals and Prizes shall continue as if they have been instituted under the KSU Act 2000 provided the funds donated or endowed are sufficient for carrying out the purposes for which the funds have been donated or endowed.

24. Skill development and Placement Cell:

In fact, this theatrical art form of Karnataka is a representative art form of our State. With a history of more than eight hundred years, Yakshagana of Coastal Karnataka has developed into a highly harmonious, synthesized theater, comprising components like powerful music, colourful costumes, vigorous dance and extempore dialogues, all in their own distinct style. In addition to its role as a form of artistic entertainment, Yakshagana has been an effective medium of information, value/moral education, especially to the masses. In its structure and performance style it enjoys both classical discipline and folk features.

- It is appropriate that Mangalore University has a centre for the study, dissemination, documentation and research of Yakshagana. Dr. P. Dayananda Pai and Sri P. Sathish Pai Trust has endowed a sum of Rupees one crore towards the establishment of Yakshagana Study Centre in Mangalore University. The activities of the centre will cover academic study, documentation, promotion, training, performances and experiments, publications, dissemination and encouragement of various activities and aspects connected with Yakshagana. Yaksha Mangala Museum: Dr.P.Dayananda Pai & Sri P.Sathish Pai Yakshagana Study Centre has a unique Yaksha Mangala Museum consisting of Models, costumes Photographs, Ornaments and Musical instruments etc. The objective of this museum and archive Centre is to depict the rich and glamorous world of Yakshagana. The museum consists of ten human size fiber made Yakshagana models. The models of main ten characters are 'Hasyavesha', 'Pundu Vesha', 'Peetike Vesha', 'Hennu Banna', 'Bheema', 'Myravana', 'Sthree Vesha', 'Kiratha', 'Hanumantha', 'Raja Vesha'. These models were prepared following traditional Tenku Thittu style of Yakshagana by Ranga Surabhi's Mahabala Kalmadka, Sullia Taluk. In addition to the Yakshagana Models (Southern style), human size fiber models representing the roles of Badaguthittu (Northern style) are installed in the Yakshamangala Museum. These models represent the following characters: 'Mukhya Sthree Vesha', 'Shreekrishna', 'Rajavesha', 'Kiratha', 'Kempu Mundasina Vesha', 'Hennu Banna', 'Bannada Vesha'. These models were prepared by Shri Shivakumar Ujire. Under the efficient guidance of Sri Jeevanram Sullia, the Yakshamangala Museum has been artistically established and various Yakshagana Models have been attractively installed. At the main gate of the Centre, two Yakshagana models with a height of fifteen feet have been installed. Museum is well maintained and visitors are well guided by the staff in the centre.

Library/ Paper cuttings: The centre has established a library with large number of books on Yakshagana. Publications on Yakshagana literature, theatre and performance have been procured and preserved in the Library. Library has got a collection of Two thousand four books. Social relevance of the chair:

Konkani is an Indo-Aryan language. It belongs to the Indo-European family of languages and is spoken in the Konkani coast of India. This region comprises the Konkani division of Maharashtra, Goa, Canara, i.e. coastal Karnataka, and a few pockets in Kerala. Depending upon the region, the language has a different dialect, pronunciation style, vocabulary, tone and significant differences in grammar. Konkani is the official language in the Indian state of Goa and is one of the official languages of India. Konkani does not have a unique script. Konkani is written in a number of scripts. Devanagari is the official script for Konkani in Goa, whereas Roman script is also popular in Goa. Amongst the Konkani population of Karnataka, the Kannada script is used. Malayalam script is used by the Konkani community in Kerala state. Arabic script is used by Konkani Muslims in coastal Maharashtra and Bhatkal taluka of Karnataka. Despite a 5000 year old heritage, encompassing a rich cultural variety perhaps unmatched in diversity in proportion to its population, the Konkani language sadly continues to suffer neglect and faces the threat of extinction. In this context, during the year 2014-15 Government of Karnataka has released a grant of Rs 2 Crore for the establishment of Konkani Adhyayana Peeta in Mangalore University to promote the interest of Konkani language, culture and heritage.

- The University Library came into existence in the year 1980. Its collections and service

facilities are fairly widespread. It has grown from mere 40,000 collections to 2,20,426 documents. The exterior and interior environment of the library building is aesthetically attractive and user friendly. The total library building area is planned for 9000 sq. meters and planned to build in three phases. Presently, we have occupied the 6250 sq.mts. It accommodates all the sections of the library. The library accommodates 450 readers at a time. The distinguished feature of the library is open access environment with an excellent natural lighting and ventilation. The library has two Xerox Machines. One Xerox machine to take care of the day to day photocopy needs of the library and another to take care of the library user's needs

- In the library a separate collection of NBHM, USIS, Pavanje Chair photo gallery and Prof. B.A. Vivek Rai's Publications are displayed in separate corners i.e. at the Entrance hall, Periodicals, Stack, Text and Kannada section. These publications have been useful to Faculty members and Research Scholars in Science, Social Science and Humanities. A collection of reprints and preprints on popular subjects is also being kept in the library. Display panels in both the gangways, provide information on various issues like – Admission information of various Universities, Appointments, Book Reviews, Do You Know, Faculty Publications, Fellowships, Orientation and Refresher Course details, Today's News etc.

Library Services:

- Library services reflect the postgraduate nature of the campus. All the readers are welcome to use the library services and facilities. New comers to the library are given orientation about the facilities and services of our library. The library staff is always available to help the readers. They orient new Students, Researchers and Faculty members at the commencement of their Academic / Research activity and as per their needs. Professionals in the library also help all users to use library facilities to the best possible extent. There is a wide range of printed and online indexing services available in the library. All key disciplines are covered. In the university's research environment, up-to-date information is essential. Library subscribe to over 305 periodical titles in hard copy, On-line Journals/databases 06, Online Bibliographical database 02 and 15,000+ online journals from UGC-INFONET and 45,000+ online journals from J-gate Database.
- This year we have started new services i.e. sending scanned copy of the content pages and cover pages of current journals to all the Faculty members of our University.

In January 2018 Library has switched over from Libsys to Koha Library software version – 17.11. This software developed by Katipu Communication of New Zealand, in 2000. It is implemented in large number of Academic and Public libraries all over the world. Koha software is user friendly, fully featured, scalable library Integrated management system. Koha software Development is sponsored by world's leading libraries, volunteers and support companies. It covers almost all sections i.e. administration, acquisition, cataloguing, circulation, display, OPAC, reports, tools etc. Koha Web OPAC links have been provided to Library books, e-books and e-journals which are accessible elsewhere in the world.

Computing Services:

- Information Kiosk has been installed in our library which provides information of all the activities of Mangalore University and it has been made web enabled with the help of Mangalore University Server. We have also installed web enabled TV providing information of all the programmes held on our campus in an online mode.
- The Library is equipped with one server and eleven terminals in all the sections of the library. It has infrastructure to retrieve information from readymade databases available in Compact Discs, Multimedia and On-line way. Smart card facility for library Users. Talking Computer for Blind students.
- The Library has one Gbps (1000 Mbps) band width connecting all terminals in university and library terminals. During this academic year, they have made provisions to Remote Access facility to access library online resources anywhere in the world to the library users. It has Wi-Fi facility to library users on the campus.

ETD Lab:

- Mangalore University Library Established Electronic Theses and Dissertations (ETD) Lab for checking plagiarism for all submitting theses and dissertations to Mangalore University. This ETD Lab has one server, one scanner / printer, four computers and five KVA UPS. We have spent Rs.4, 35,122/- for the same. We have procured "Turnitin" Software to check Plagiarism of theses and dissertations submitted to Mangalore University at the cost of Rs. 3.50 Lakhs. 360+ Theses and 200+ Research papers has been checked under plagiarism software. Mangalore University library has digitized and uploaded 1256 Theses and 130 M.Phil Dissertations to Shodhganga Project of INFLIBNET at Ahmedabad. And D space Institutional Repository software.

UGC-INFONET Learning Resource Centre:

- CYBER LAB is having 56 computers. It has helped 7622 users in accessing the required information from all the e-resources available in our library from UGC-Infonet and from other sources.

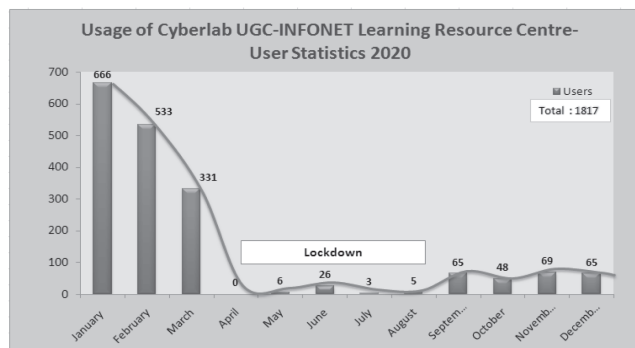

Introduction

- UGC has been assisting the Universities for setting up of Computer Centre since 1990 for research, training and application of computers in every field/subject. Consequently Mangalore University Computer Centre was established in 1990.
- Computer Centre plays a key role in today's knowledge driven society. It provides comprehensive Information Communication technology (ICT) services to Academic/ Administrative departments of the university. Its key services includes providing reliable and available ICT infrastructure comprising of computational services and Internet services. Computer

Centre maintains reasonably good ICT environment and augments the same from time to time as and when needed. It is also geared up to provide uninterrupted IT services to the end users.

- Cyber Lab is a centralized computational facility comprising of 40 desktop system and application software. The Computer Centre is coming up with another centralized Computer Lab of 80 computers to cater the needs of the facility/students.
- The Computer Centre provides internet services through two independent Internet service providers (ISPs). One is through NKN with high speed connection of up to 1 Gbps and the other through 35 Mbps leased line from BSNL. Entire campus is configured as a set of Virtual Local area networks (VLAN). The connectivity within the department is extended through CAT5/.CAT6 UTP cabling, while connectivity across the building is established through OFC backbone. Core switch at the Computer Centre provides high speed switching required across the campus network. The switch in the Department/Office/Building is used to provide wired connectivity to class rooms / faculty rooms / Labs etc. The internet access is made available to all users through wired Ethernet outlets and Campus wide Wi-Fi (Wireless) facility for authentic users.

Operation and Maintenance

- Extended Computer Annual Maintenance Service for a period of monthly maintenance basis, on pro-rate basis at the rate of Rs 82,163/-per month.
- Co-ordination for Annual Maintenance Contract for networking items in the campus at a cost of Rs. 8, 37,800=00.
- Co-ordination for Annual Maintenance Contract for Wi-Fi networking in the campus at a cost of Rs. 8, 26,000=00.
- Maintenance of university website - www.mangaloreuniversity.ac.in by updating the contents from time to time.
- Co-ordinated the procurement of purchase of toner Cartridges for Laser under rate contract purchase. 109 cartridges worth Rs.5,91,546/- were purchased for the year 2020.21
- Maintenance of in-house mail server – mail.mangaloreuniversity.ac.in.
- Extended use of Internet services by providing 182 LAN I/O points to the following departments/offices at total cost of Rs. 6,62,756/-, under rate contract scheme.

Facilities

- **Computational Facilities:** Computer Centre houses mail server and web server, to provide ICT services. These servers are connected to clients in cyber lab and other PG Departments/offices/centres. Campus network on OFC interconnects all computers systems in one logical network facilitating services to be utilized from any server on the network. The overall campus network diagram is as shown in Fig.1. Central servers and network services are available round the clock on 24x7 basis.
- **Cyber Lab Facility:** Cyber lab is the facility made available to all users. It houses 40 desktop

systems with internet connectivity. It also has adequate peripherals such as printers, scanners. Cyber lab is operational from 9.00 AM to 7.00 PM on all working days. Cyber lab utilisation for the year under report is shown in Fig 2

- **New Central Computer Lab:** A central computer lab facility was established during January 2021. The lab contains 80 desktops of various configuration which can be used for the research, lab practical and web browsing. Around 50 desktops were installed by assembling the parts available in the disposed desktops. Hence saving an approximate amount of 20 Lakhs. This Lab is now the major central computer lab available for all the departments of the university. Central computer lab is operational from 10.00 AM to 5.30 PM on all working days.
- **E-mail Facility:** Computer Centre hosts in-house mail server with domain mail. Mangaloreuniversity.ac.in. Web based mail services are available on independent server with open source mailing solution.
- **Internet facility:** Internet communication is the lifeline in today's connected digital world. University provides Internet facility through two service providers viz NKN and BSNL. NKN provides full text access to scholarly journals on a 1 Gbps leased line. BSNL provides additional separate 35 Mbps leased line. Gateway level appliance provides firewall services, anti spam, anti-virus intrusion detection and content filtering services. This ensures secure and safe internet experience to all users. Internet access is available at all departments/offices round the clock on 24X7 basis.
- **IP Phone facility:** The Computer Centre also houses the IPPBX appliance (Cisco be3000) to provide VoIP services through IP phones.
- **Wi-Fi Facility:** The solution consists of central controller and access points distributed across the campus. The access points conform to the IEEE standard 802.11 ac, which ensures ideal data transfer speed of 1300Mbps. There are 190 indoor access points deployed to give coverage within the buildings on the campus and 10 outdoor access points to give coverage in open spaces outside the buildings. All the access points are controlled by central WLAN controller. This controller controls major functions of access points such as authentication, encryption, quality of service etc. This also acts as management console to configure the access points by the administrator. We have provided a redundant controller to ensure high availability, in the event of failure of main controller. Security is the major concern in Wi-Fi usage. We have ensured adequate security – both for connectivity to Wi-Fi network and to the data transferred over the air. The user is allowed to access only through the registered mobile device, where MAC id of the device shall be the identifying feature. Additionally user has to authenticate using the user name and password assigned to him.
- **CCTV Surveillance System:** Closed-circuit television (CCTV) also known as video surveillance, is the use of video cameras to transmit a signal to a specific place, on a limited set of monitors. CCTV camera systems have one or more cameras which are used to send video, images and audio data to a monitor. Essentially, these camera systems use cameras to transmit the signals to a main hub which then records that data for later viewing or live viewing, if you have full time

security personnel on the premises. There are totally 147 cameras of different types installed in the Campus, covering most of the area of the University. An expert engineer is available in the campus for maintaining the setup. The total setup is being maintained by AMC Contract which will be renewed every year through government e-procurement procedure. The setup has a capacity of storing the footage for the period of recent past 30 days of recording. Which can be viewed or the footage of particular time slot can be copied separately if require. The separate networking setup including the network tower, wireless RF based connectivity has been established for the CCTV and Surveillance System, hence it is not affecting the regular internet of the campus. The main control of the entire setup is hosted in the Computer Centre.

The Computer Centre extends its services in the following areas:

- Software Development and / Implementation
- Technical Consultancy Services for Hardware, Software procurment and deployment
- Computer Training Programs as and when needed
- Data Processing
- Major Services extended include
 - AMC services for computers and peripherals on the campus(Fig 3)
 - Procurement of purchase of toner cartridges for laser and Inkjet printers(Rate Contract)
 - AMC services for networking devices and IPPBX appliance
 - Providing network related services on rate contract basis
 - Providing internet services from two independent service providers
 - Operation and maintenance of cyber lab.
 - Providing Wi-Fi Campus Networking.
 - Providing CCTV Surveillance System.
- **Data Processing:** Mr. Manohara M Goranakolla, Mr.Vijay G participated in various stages of software development / implementations such as analysis, programming, data entry and data processing activities related to Finance office, Registrar's office and Registrar (Evaluation) of Mangalore University.
- **Software Development and Maintenance:** The computer center is also involved in software development based on university requirements. During year 2020-21. The computer center developed and maintain the following software at the university campus.
 - Student Feedback System
 - Faculty Feedback System
 - Grievance Address System
 - AMC of Computers Call Report System
 - Guest Faculty Recruitment System

- Online Classes, Meeting and Conferences: During the pandemic period the online teaching was the major aspect for continuing the academic work. Hence the computer centre procured and provided WebEx licensees to each department and constituent colleges of the university. Conducted two training programs on using the WebEx. The centre was also involved in successfully conducting Online Video Conferences and Online Meetings.
- Implementation of Software's /Applications provided by Government: Computer Centre is actively involved in the implementation of the software's / applications provided by government such as: UUCMS, HRMS, e-Office, NAD, SSP, Online Affiliations

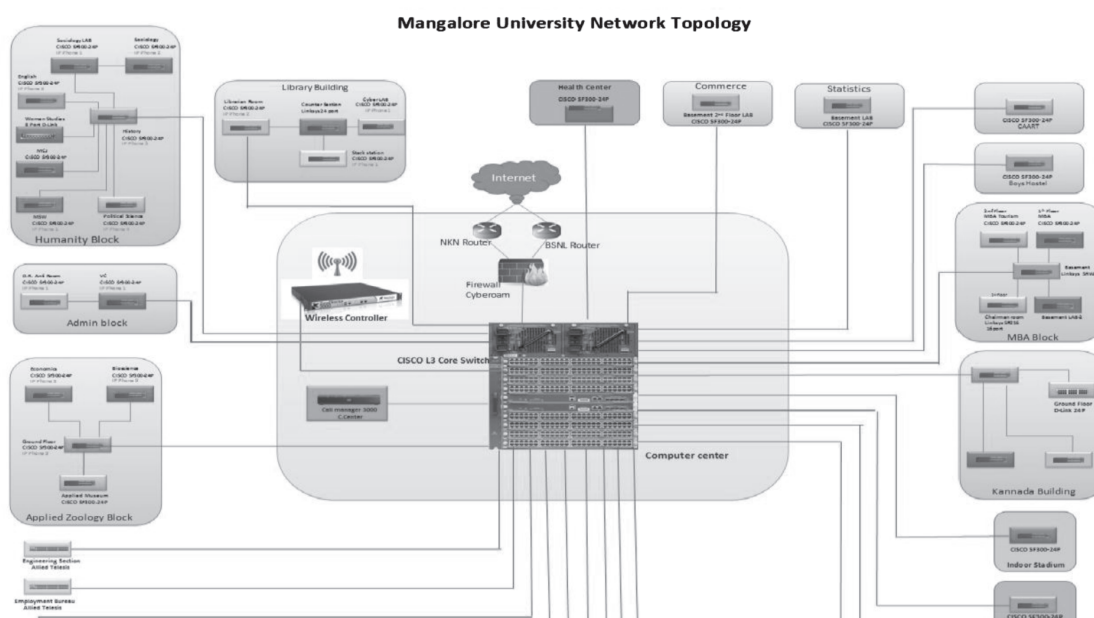


Fig-1 Network Diagram

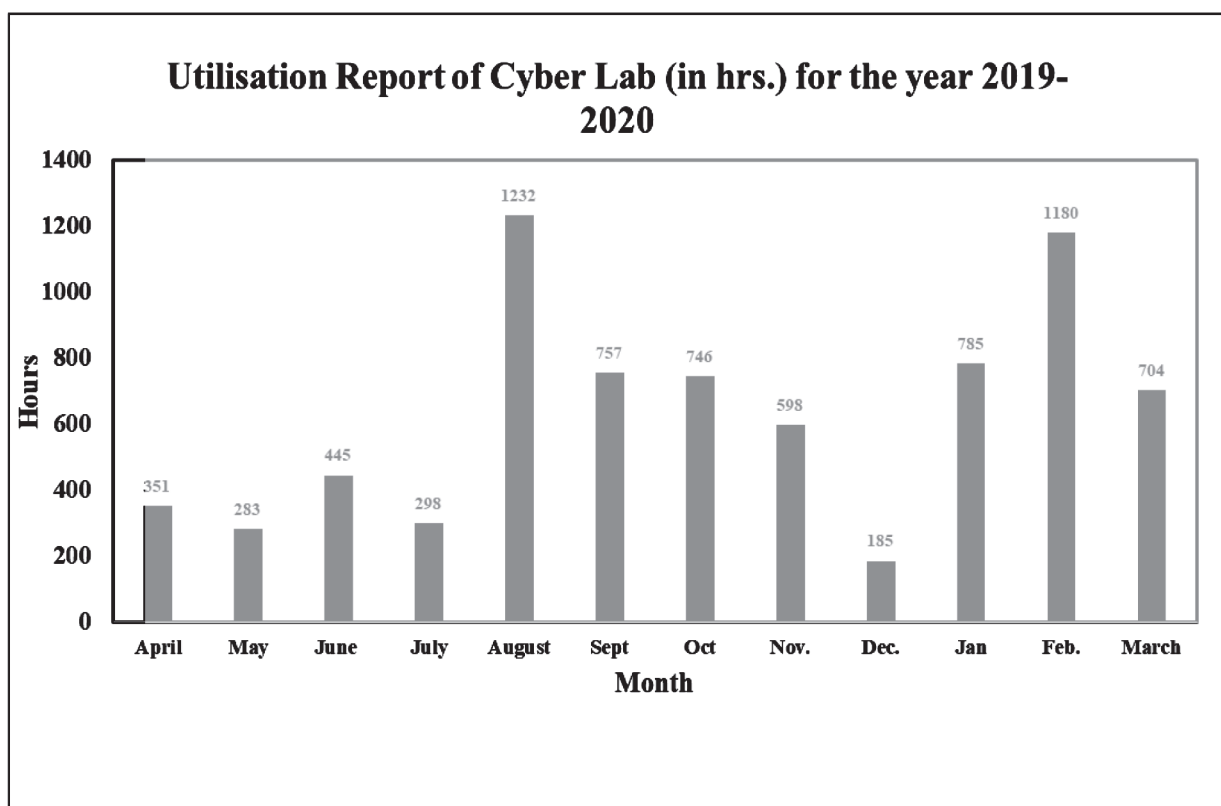


Fig-2 Utilisation Report of Cyber Lab

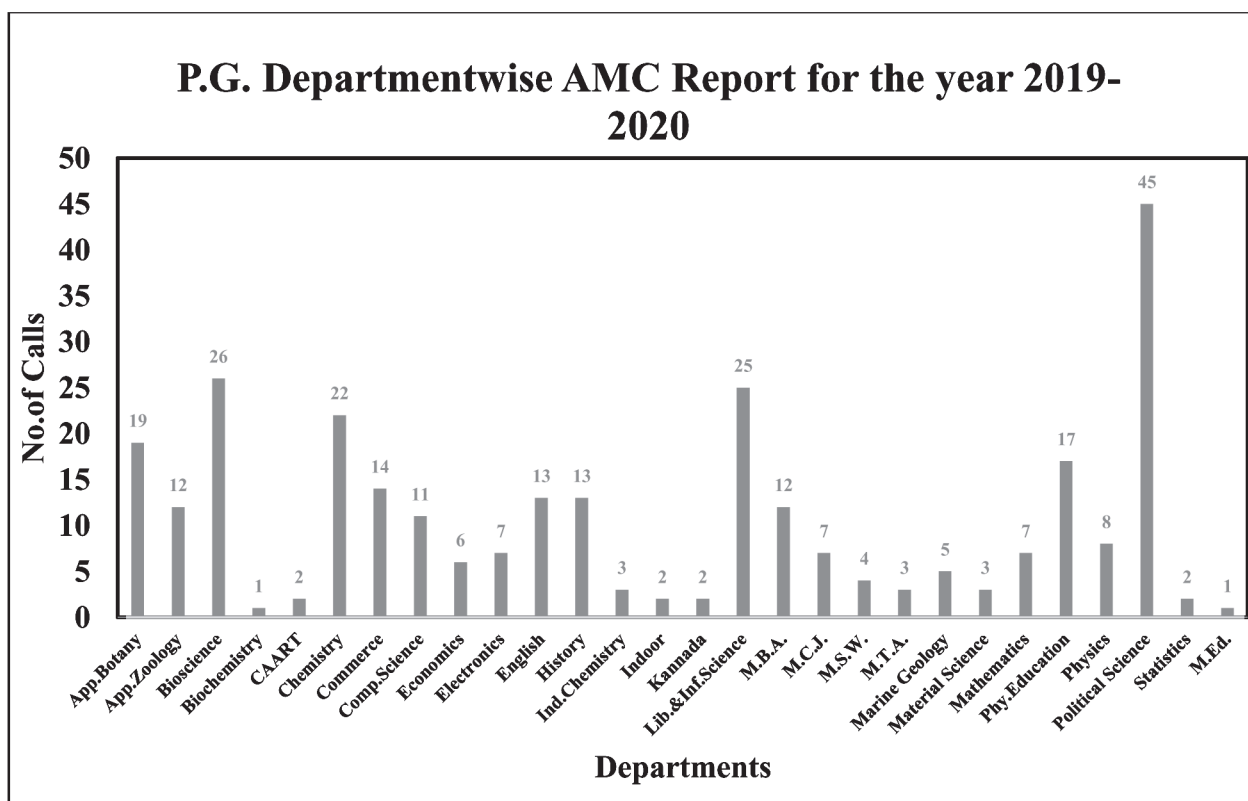


Fig-3 PG Departmentwise AMC Report

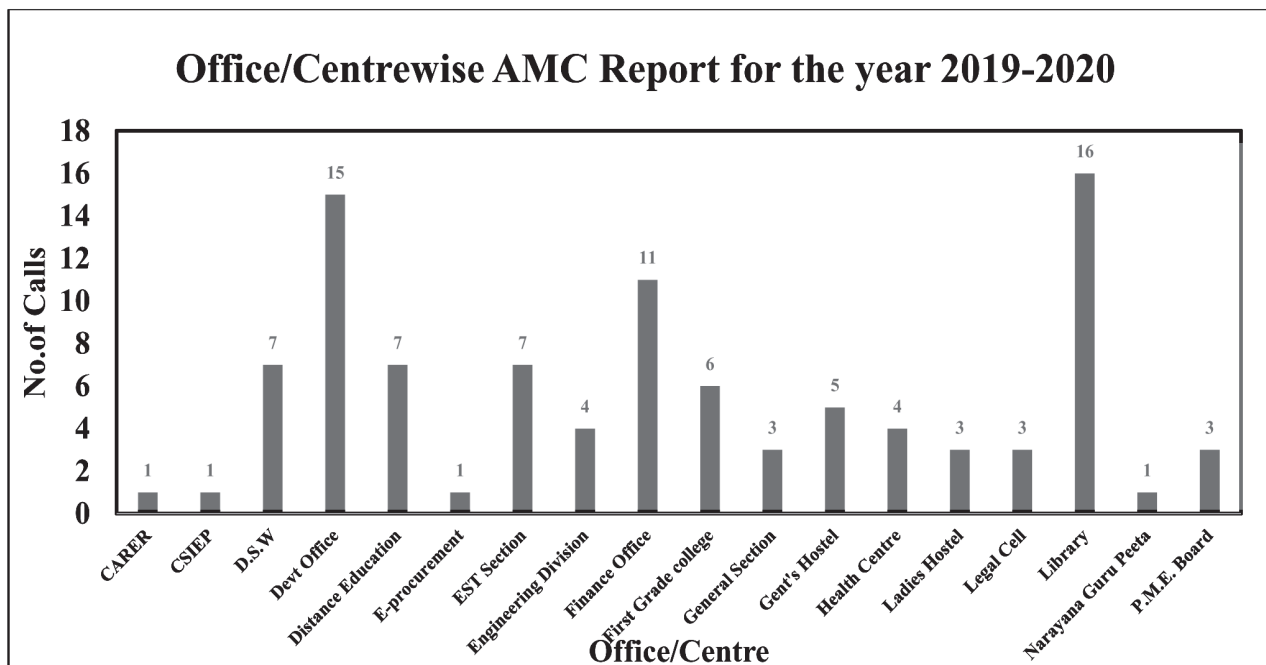


Fig-3 Office/Centrewise AMC Report
